Subj: COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS OUTCOME MEASURES FOR 2<sup>nd</sup> HALF 2002

Enclosed are the 2<sup>nd</sup> Half 2002 performance outcome measure results for your county. Meeting these outcomes is part of the intergovernmental agreement between the state and the county. The outcome measures are:

1. Reduce recidivism, as measured by felony convictions from initial admission to probation, tracking for three years from admission.
2. Reduce recidivism, as measured by felony convictions from first release to parole/post-prison supervision, tracking for three years from release.
3. Increase the percentage of positive case closures for offenders on probation.
4. Increase the percentage of positive case closures for offenders on parole/post-prison supervision.
5. Reduce the rate of high-risk offenders on abscond status.
6. Increase the percentage of restitution and compensatory fines collected that is owed to victims (this outcome is in development and is not being reported out on at this time).

Also enclosed are performance data, tables and charts for each outcome. If you do not receive certain charts specific to your county's performance, it is because the number of offenders in the category was very small, making such charts difficult to interpret and present. For comparison purposes, additional tables and charts are included to demonstrate how your 2<sup>nd</sup> Half 2002 rates compare to other counties.




## Parole/Post-Prison Supervision Recidivism Rates - 1st Half 2002








# Probation Recidivism Rates - 2nd Half 2002

## Clatsop County




## Probation Recidivism Rates - 2nd Half 2002




# Probation Recidivism Rates - 2nd Half 2002




## Parole/Post-Prison Supervision Recidivism Rates - 1st Half 2002








# Probation Recidivism Rates - 2nd Half 2002

## Coos County






# Probation Recidivism Rates - 2nd Half 2002




# Probation Recidivism Rates - 2nd Half 2002

## Douglas County






# Probation Recidivism Rates - 2nd Half 2002

## Hood River County






# Probation Recidivism Rates - 2nd Half 2002




# Probation Recidivism Rates - 2nd Half 2002

## Klamath County






# Probation Recidivism Rates - 2nd Half 2002




# Probation Recidivism Rates - 2nd Half 2002

## Malheur County


































### Statewide Probation Recidivism Rates through 2nd Half 2002


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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
# Probation Positive Case Closures through 2nd Half 2002 (Statewide Total)






## Probation Positive Case Closures by County for 2nd Half 2002 (Number of Closures >30)




