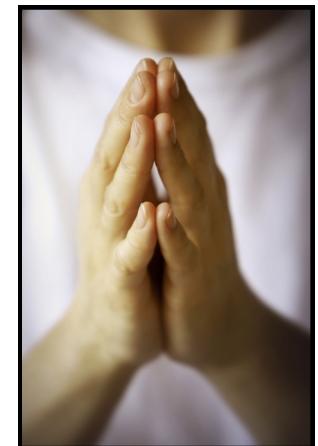

## WHAT DOES RELIGIOUS SERVICES HAVE TO OFFER?

### CHAPLAINCY

Religious Services, the oldest correctional program, provides a wide continuum of worship services, study programs, music programs, serious illness/death notifications, and spiritual counseling opportunities to meet the mandates of the U.S. Constitution, Oregon Constitution and judicial decisions.

Twenty-one chaplains serve at thirteen facilities statewide. They represent a variety of faith traditions including Buddhist, Christian, Islamic, and more. Regardless of each chaplain's faith tradition, he or she is committed to facilitating the services that meet the spiritual needs of the inmates. Together with religious services volunteers, hundreds of different religious and spiritual services representing over thirty faith traditions are offered in facilities across the state.

### HGO

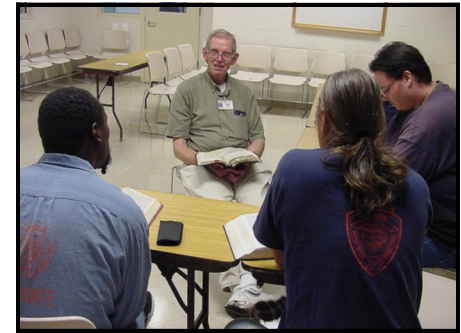
Home for Good in Oregon (HGO) is an award-winning re-entry program of the Department of Corrections. Starting with applications received from offenders wanting faith and community support following release, HGO provides information and support using a broad statewide network of over 45 community chaplains. In addition, there are hundreds of trained community volunteers and re-entry partner organizations who ensure that faith and community-based support and services are effectively offered.

### VOLUNTEER SERVICES

Over 2100 volunteers donate more than 300,000 hours annually. Almost three quarters serve in religious services, allowing the department to provide for the diverse religious and spiritual needs of its inmates. The other quarter of our volunteers provide a variety of programs: education, lifeskills, 12-step alcohol and drug programs, assistance for inmates transitioning to the community and more.

### VICTIM SERVICES

Victim services offers the following programs to crime victims/survivors:

- *The Facilitated Dialogue Program* is a victim-initiated service for crime victims and survivors who wish to have contact with the inmate convicted of a crime against them.
- *VINE* is a free and anonymous telephone and email service designed to provide victims with timely information regarding an offender's custody status and location so they can make key decisions about their safety.
- *Victim/Survivor Speaker Network* The Speakers Network provides a venue for crime victim/survivors to share their experience with inmates in a correctional setting.
