In short, a good lesson plan promotes consistent instruction and accord within a team of instructors. A legal record of what you taught students. If a civil suit is filed and your students or agency are named, lesson plans considered germane will be subpoenaed. A starting point for evaluating the effectiveness of your training. Well-written learning objectives are the foundation of your lesson plan. They determine what you will teach and how, and provide a basis for determining whether students can apply what you taught.

Overview: The Oregon Drug Evaluation and Classification Program (DECP) have received national acclaim for its success in identifying the drug impaired driver. Advanced Roadside Impairment Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) was developed by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and created to address the gap between Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) and the Drug Evaluation and Classification (DEC) Program. ARIDE is a 16 hour curriculum that provides officers with general knowledge related to drug impairment and promotes the use of certified Drug Recognition Experts. Additionally, ARIDE is an intermediate level impaired driving course with an SFST proficiency examination. The student should be fully conversant with the HGN procedural "mechanics" of HGN with the three clues of HGN and with the interpretation of those clues for assessing alcohol impairment. A major focus is on the examination of a drug-impaired suspect's eyes and the procedures of those eye examinations derive largely from HGN procedures. The successful completion of this course does not qualify the student as a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE). **Pre-requisites:** The student applying for ARIDE should be familiar with the extent of the drug impaired driving problem and must have completed the basic Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST), Drugs that Impair Driving, and a recent SFST refresher/update. **Attire:** November 12 - Agency uniform.
