RULE SUMMARY

The proposed amendments to OAR 471-030-0080 make the following changes:

- Revise "Professional Technical Training" to "Career and Technical Training" as a result of changes in HB 2109, which passed in the 2009 Legislative Session.
- Defines when the Director may waive the requirement that an individual be a full time student to be approved for training. This change removes the reference to ORS 657.337, which was repealed by HB 2203 in the 2009 Legislative Session.
- Clarify eligibility requirements for unemployment benefits to individuals who are in approved training. Individuals who do not attend their approved training during the week are required to meet regular unemployment insurance eligibility requirements for those weeks.

The agency requests public comment on whether other options should be considered for achieving the rule's substantive goals while reducing the negative economic impact of the rule on business.

*Rulemaking Notices published in the Oregon Bulletin must be submitted by 5:00 pm on the 15th day of the preceding month unless this deadline falls on a weekend or legal holiday, upon which the deadline is 5:00 pm the preceding workday. A public rulemaking hearing may be requested in writing by 10 or more people, or by an association with 10 or more members, within 21 days following the publication of the Rulemaking Notice in the Oregon Bulletin or 28 days from the date Notice was sent to people on the agency mailing list, whichever is later. If sufficient hearing requests are received, notice of the date and time of the rulemaking hearing must be published in the Oregon Bulletin at least 14 days before the hearing.
