**NOTICE OF INTENT TO APPLY FOR A SITE CERTIFICATE
FOR THE PROPOSED ROCK CREEK WIND POWER FACILITY**

Date: September 10, 2010

Rock Creek Wind Power, LLC, (the applicant) has submitted a “Notice of Intent for a Site Certificate for the Rock Creek Wind Power Facility” (NOI). The Oregon Department of Energy (Department) requests public comment on the NOI.

Copies of the NOI will be available for public inspection at the Oregon Department of Energy, 625 Marion St. NE, Salem, Oregon; at the Gilliam County Library, 310 S. Main in Condon; at the Arlington Public Library, 500 West First Street in Arlington; and at the Boardman Library, 200 South Main Street in Boardman. The NOI will be available at the Department’s Hermiston Field Office, 395 E. Highland Avenue in Hermiston (please call for an appointment, 541-567-3840). The Proposed Rock Creek Wind Power Facility

The proposed Rock Creek Wind Power Facility (RCWPF) would have a peak generating capacity of up to 550 megawatts. The applicant has not selected a turbine type, but the applicant is considering turbines ranging from 1.8-MW to 3.0-MW each. The RCWPF would consist of 183 to 305 wind turbines. Other facility components include two substations, an operations and maintenance facility, up to 3 meteorological towers, access roads, and aboveground and underground transmission lines. The proposed facility site is entirely on private lands located in Gilliam County approximately 3.5 miles north of Condon. The turbine micro-siting area would lie approximately 17 miles south of Arlington. The NOI contains a more detailed description of the proposed facility.

The applicant intends to connect the RCWPF to the regional transmission system, either through a proposed Bonneville Power Administration substation (the Diamond Butte Substation) adjacent to the existing 500-kV Slatt-Buckley transmission line or through a proposed Portland General Electric (PGE) substation (the Cedar Springs substation) adjacent to the proposed 500-kV Cascade Crossing transmission line. PGE has submitted a Notice of Intent to apply for a site certificate for the proposed Cascade Crossing transmission line. An aboveground 230-kV transmission line would connect the RCWPF substations to the selected interconnection site.

The Department will hold an informational meeting on the NOI on October 6, 2010, in Condon. At the meeting, the Department will explain the site certificate review process and opportunities for public participation. The applicant will answer questions. The public may comment on the proposed facility and may ask questions about the facility and the site certificate process.

The informational meeting is not a contested case hearing. Instead, it is an opportunity to ask questions and give comments about the proposed RCWPF at a very early stage in the process. A formal public hearing (described in OAR 345-015-0220) will be scheduled much later in the process after the Department has issued a Draft Proposed Order. Failure to comment in person or in writing on the record of that future public hearing precludes participation in any later contested case proceeding and the right to

appeal the Council's final decision. Any comments made at the informational meeting on October 6 do not preserve these rights.

Site Certificate Review Process

Before the RCWPF can be built, the Oregon Energy Facility Siting Council (Siting Council) will review the site certificate application and decide whether the proposed facility complies with the requirements for a site certificate. The NOI contains preliminary information about the facility and its potential impacts. The NOI simply provides notice to the Department and to the public that the applicant intends to submit a site certificate application in the future.

The NOI lets the public know about the proposed facility and gives interested state agencies and affected local governments an opportunity to identify applicable requirements and special issues of concern. The public may comment on the NOI so that local concerns can become known and the applicant can address them in the site certificate application.

The applicant expects to submit a Preliminary Application for a Site Certificate in January 2011. If the Preliminary Application is not complete, the Department will ask the applicant to submit additional information. The additional information will be provided to the public in an Application Supplement when the Department determines that the application is complete. At that time, the Department will issue a public notice and request public comment on the complete application. The complete Application for Site Certificate consists of the Preliminary Application plus the Application Supplement.

The Application for Site Certificate must demonstrate that the proposed RCWPF meets standards established under ORS 469.501 by the Siting Council and set forth in OAR Chapter 345, Divisions 22 and 24. The applicant intends to satisfy the Land Use Standard by seeking a Siting Council determination under ORS 469.504(1)(b) instead of seeking separate land use determinations by Gilliam County. The Siting Council will consult with Gilliam County and will apply the local land use ordinances identified by the county as being applicable to the proposed land use.

The Department serves as staff to the Siting Council and conducts the application process. The Department's website at oregon.gov/ENERGY/SITING/process.shtml includes a full description of the site certificate review process.

Comments on the Notice of Intent

You may comment on the NOI at the information meeting on October 6 or by sending written comments to the Department. **This comment period ends on October 15, 2010.** Written comments or questions can be submitted by regular mail, e-mail or fax and must be received by the deadline.
