Description of Fees and Expenses:

Per Diem Rate: \$880 per day for hearing and for time spent on preparation, research and drafting of the decision/award; a hearing day is any portion of a day up to eight hours. Time for research and preparation is prorated.

Cancellation policy. If the scheduled hearing is postponed or canceled with notice of less than thirty (30) days, the per diem fee for each day of hearing shall be charged if another matter cannot be set in its place. Cancellation may also include any fees incurred for canceled flights or hotel rooms

Travel time: Arbitrator charges ½ day per diem fee for any portion of travel up to four hours. A full day per diem is charged when travel time exceeds four hours. Travel is calculated from the Portland, Oregon airport. Travel time is not charged for travel on a hearing day.

Expenses: Arbitrator charges the actual cost for reasonable expenses incurred after arrival at Portland Airport, including car rental or taxis, food, lodging, parking, and tolls.
