Package Number and Title: 102, Flood Hazard Map Modernization

Short Package Description: This package will allow the department to receive federal funds and meet its obligations as a Cooperating Technical Partner under the Federal Emergency Management Act (FEMA) Flood Hazard Map Modernization Initiative. Denial of this package would prevent the department's ability to satisfy this obligation. Tasks: (A) Collect available data from communities during the map modernization pre-scoping phase and screen data against FEMA standards; (B) Build an accurate statewide floodplain database using best available information guided by Oregon's floodplain data exchange standard and state floodplain maintenance plan procedures; and (C) Review ordinances for communities that must adopt final digital flood insurance rate maps to remain in the National Flood Insurance Program.

Target Impact – GIS floodplain coverage usable by local, state and federal agencies and private entities							

This measure addresses compilation of all available flood hazard information from private and local, state and federal public sources collected in previous work under the package, and converting the information to a digital format when required, and making it available for use by common geographic information system platforms. Due to project ramp-up time, the statewide digital map (or "coverage") is expected to be only 25 percent complete at the end of the first year of the biennium, while the remaining 75 percent of the state will be complete by the end of the biennium. The outcome will be readily available, accessible floodplain location information that can be used by state and local hazard managers, property owners, and developers.

<i>Target Impact – Adoption of floodplain maps by six local governments</i>							

This measure pertains to implementation of flood hazard protection by revising ordinances to reflect the new FEMA flood maps and federal flood program regulations. The department will work with six counties during the biennium to develop and enact updates to those counties' floodplain zone ordinances. Only six counties are scheduled for final map adoption in the biennium (three during the first year of the biennium and three during the second) because final FEMA maps will not be ready for other counties in the biennium to permit them to complete the adoption process before June 2009. The department will assist additional counties if they reach the adoption phase sooner than expected.

PART C: Other Impacts and Ensuring Successful Package Implementation:

In addition to the tasks reflected in the narrative above, DLCD staff will collect and screen data from local jurisdictions to be used by FEMA to develop digital flood insurance rate maps. DLCD staff will also train local jurisdictions in the use of digital flood maps, resulting in more efficient and better coordinated flood hazard protection and response.
