### LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Under this agenda item, the department will report to the commission regarding the status of land use legislation, including the department's proposed legislation and other legislation that affects land use policy or the department.

The status of legislation proposed or tracked by the department changes almost daily, and as such information in this report may be out of date by the time the commission meets. The department will supplement this report with updated information at the meeting.

#### **I. OVERVIEW**

June 1 was the deadline for closing all committees (except Rules, Ways and Means, and Revenue committees). As such, the list of approximately 150 bills related to land use that DLCD is tracking has been reduced substantially. Attachment A to this report shows the live and passed bills as of the date of the report (this list includes only "Priority 1, 2, and 3" bills – it does not include other tracked bills that do not affect land use policy but that may affect the agency in some manner). Most of the bills on the list are passing or have passed; this list does not include the large number of tracked bills that have not passed.

#### **II. DLCD LEGISLATION**

The Department's budget (HB 5032) passed both houses and was signed by the Governor on June 7. It is effective July 1, 2011.

At the start of the 2011 session, the Governor proposed four bills at the request of LCDC and the department. All four of these bills have passed and are either on the Governor's desk or have been signed.

**HB 2129 – Improve Post-acknowledgement Plan Amendment (PAPA) Notice Procedures.**

Improves and clarifies notice requirements in statute regarding local plan or code amendments. Moves the current "paper" notice system toward an on-line system, and adjusts the notice system to better respond to changes in proposed local amendments that occur after the initial notice.

**HB 2130 – Streamline State Review of Urban Growth Boundary (UGB) Amendments.**

Improves and streamlines the process for review of local urban growth boundary (UGB) and urban reserve decisions "in the manner of periodic review." Resolves gaps and ambiguities in current procedural requirements and clarifies record, scope and standards for LCDC review. Ensures concerns are raised and addressed at the local level before being raised at the LCDC review level. Initial version expedited Court of Appeals review of LCDC decisions regarding UGB and urban reserve amendments, but this proposal had a large fiscal impact and was removed.

**HB 2131 – Clarify Statutes Regarding Needed Housing.** Statutes under ORS 197.303-197.307 ensure that cities provide sufficient land to accommodate needed housing. These laws have been subject to numerous amendments over the past 30 years and as a result no longer present a clear coherent statement, and their interpretation has been further clouded by sometimes conflicting case law. This legislation consolidates, re-orders, and otherwise clarifies these statutes consistent with their intent.

**HB 2132 – Adjust Transfer of Development Rights (TDR) Pilot Program.** The 2009 Legislature established a Transfer of Development Rights (TDR) Pilot Program, administered by DLCD, to test TDRs as a market-based method to conserve forest land for forest use. The law authorized up to three "pilot projects" to test these TDR ideas on the ground. Some specific requirements of this pilot program have proved to be unworkable, and at present there are no approved pilot projects. DLCD proposes to adjust the law with respect to the specific provisions that are problematic. This bill authorizes additional unincorporated communities as "receiving areas" for transferred rights, and allows higher transfer ratios in certain circumstances.

## **II. LEGISLATION CONCERNING URBAN ISSUES**

**HB 3225:** This bill initially authorized an exception for a new road in the Metro urban reserve area, a road in Washington County intended to connect I-5 and Hwy 99 from Tigard to Wilsonville. As the bill moved through the Senate, it was amended to add an additional highway exception for the Schute Road interchange in Washington County. The House did not concur with the Senate amendments, and a conference committee instead inserted new amendments proposed by Metro to allow new exceptions for roads in Metro Urban reserves. In other words, this provision is much broader than the initial bill, and overturns the LCDC rule prohibition on new exceptions for roads in urban reserves (it does not address rural reserves, where such exceptions are still prohibited). The bill has passed and is on the Governor's desk.

**SB 766:** This bill requires the designation of at least five and not more than 15 regionally significant industrial areas. It allows for expedited permitting of industrial uses in regionally significant industrial areas. The bill also establishes the Economic Recovery Review Council,

intended to expedite the development of industrial projects of state significance, and designate industrial areas as “regionally significant”. The Council will be staffed by OBDD staff, and that OBDD will act as the prime agency for interaction with applicants.

**SB 795:** requires the Land Conservation and Development Commission (LCDC) to consider amendments to the Transportation Planning Rule before January 1, 2012 for purposes of streamlining, simplifying and clarifying certain aspects of rule. The bill also requires the Oregon Transportation Commission (OTC) to consider amendments to the mobility standards contained in the Oregon Highway Plan before January 1, 2012.

### **III. LEGISLATION CONCERNING FARM AND FOREST LAND**

**HB 3408A** Irrigation reservoir siting by special districts on farmland will become an outright use due to this legislation. Currently, this use is a conditional use allowing counties to provide for local review and conduct a public hearing. The bill was amended to provide that parks and other recreational structures cannot be approved as part of the irrigation reservoir siting process. LCDC will consider recommendations for amendments to OARs in light of this legislation at its June meeting. *Status: On the Governor’s desk.*

**HB 3465A:** This bill, as amended, authorizes the owner of the “Silvies Valley Ranch Development Area” to develop a 5000-acre guest ranch with up to 575 units of overnight accommodations and commercial uses. It exempts the development from statutes relating to guest ranches and other specified land use and land division statutes, statewide land use planning goals, and provisions of Grant County’s acknowledged comprehensive plan and land use regulations. Findings related to economic benefits and wildlife protection are required by the county Board before a master plan can be approved. *Status: Passed the House. Passed Senate Rules with amendments.*

**HB 3615:** Allows Jackson, Josephine and Douglas Counties to petition LCDC to establish regional goal definitions for ‘agricultural land’ and ‘forestland’ for purposes of statewide land use planning. If the commission adopts new definitions, the bill provides for these counties to rezone land that no longer meets the definition – most likely as ‘nonresource land’ allowing residential and/or other rural development subject to LCDC approval. The standards and process for that approval are described in statute resulting from passage of HB 2229 (2009). The bill appropriates moneys for this project to the Department of Land Conservation and Development. The department will make grants available to Jackson, Josephine and Douglas Counties, and also appropriates money to the Departments of Agriculture, Forestry, and Water Resources. *Status: In full Ways & Means.*

**HB 3620:** Allows a person to file a request for reconsideration of a claim under Ballot Measure 49 (2007) if the person’s date of acquisition of the property was affected by conveyance and reacquisition of the property within a 10-day period. Approximately 7-10 claims may be affected by this legislation. *Status: On the Governor’s desk.*

**SB 960:** Creates processes by which a county may conditionally approve commercial events or activities related to and supportive of agriculture in areas zoned for exclusive farm use. This bill contains provisions recommended by an Association of Oregon Counties work force resulting

from direction given by a legislative committee considering SB 1055 in 2010. The bill contains primarily elements related to events and activities on farm land. Other elements of the task force recommendation related to wineries are largely contained in HB 3280, greatly revised. *Status: On the Governor's desk.*

**HB 3280:** The major vehicle for winery legislation, this bill continues to be subject to additional amendments at the time of this report. Key, but ever changing (due to amendments) elements relate to size and scale of events, activities, and food facilities allowed, based on winery size and capacity. The department will report on the most recent proposed amendments to the bill. *Status: In conference committee*

**SB 829:** This bill primarily benefits large wineries producing over 150,000 gallons of wine annually with at least 50 acres in vineyards. These wineries are allowed full service restaurants and specified event authorizations. *Status: Passed Senate and awaiting 3<sup>rd</sup> reading in the House.*

#### **IV. OTHER LEGISLATION OF INTEREST**

Several other land use related bills were still “alive” at the time of this report and may be of interest to the commission:

**HB 2009:** The bill amends current marine reserve provisions calling for additional rulemaking reporting and public involvement requirements. Marine Reserves *Status: In W&M natural resources subcommittee.*

**HB 3166:** Provides a 10-year “statute of ultimate repose” to declare “acknowledged” those local land use decisions that were approved locally but have not been acknowledged under provisions of law, typically because a local government did not provide the required notice to DLCD and/or others.
