- 1. Welcome and Introductions.** The task force will receive testimony and words of welcome from Governor Ted Kulongoski, Senate President Peter Courtney, and Troy Nichols, Chief of Staff to House Speaker Karen Minnis.
- 2. Election of Chair and Vice-Chair.** Senate Bill 82 provides that the task force will elect a chairperson from its members. The task force may elect a chair at this time, and may elect a vice-chair.
- 3. Overview of History of Oregon Land Use Program.** Senate Bill 82 provides that the members of the task force will be “knowledgeable about Oregon’s land use system.” The task force will receive an overview of the history of the state land use program presented by staff, with the participation of Steve Bryant, former city planner and city manager (currently acting executive director of the League of Oregon Cities); and Hanley Jenkins, planning director for Union County (and current member of the Land Conservation and Development Commission).
- 4. Overview of Oregon’s Economy, Past, Present and Future.** Senate Bill 82 provides that the task force will be “familiar with Oregon’s economic and employment base.” The task force will receive an overview of Oregon’s economy from Dae Beck, Deputy State Economist.
- 5. Review of Senate Bill 82.** Staff will lead a review and discussion by the task force of Senate Bill 82, and the charge to the task force.

- 6. Task Force Business.** The task force reserves this time to discuss other items of business relating to the organization and operation of the task force. Such items may include, but are not limited to, future meetings, appointment of subcommittees and related workgroups, appointment of consultants to serve the task force, strategies for public outreach and participation, and solicitation of additional resources to support the work of the task force.

The Oregon Task Force on Land Use Planning was established under Senate Bill 82 (2005). The purpose of the task force is to study and make recommendations on: (a) The effectiveness of Oregon's land use planning program in meeting current and future needs of Oregonians in all parts of the state; (b) The respective roles and responsibilities of state and local governments in land use planning; and (c) Land use issues specific to areas inside and outside urban growth boundaries and the interface between areas inside and outside urban growth boundaries. The task force receives staff support from the Department of Land Conservation and Development.
