The OBCE has opened up discussion on these three rules topics. At present any rule drafts are very much just that, drafts. The Rules Committee is asked to discuss these proposed rule draft/issues. - 1) **Chiropractic Professional Corporation and Business Entity Majority Ownership, OAR 811-010-0120.** The OBCE has voted to enter into permanent rulemaking for the purpose of addressing clinic ownership & contractual arrangements which appear to be flouting the intent of this rule (Majority DC ownership and control). This is different from the recently adopted Clinic Owners Responsibility Rule. We've requested the Board's legal counsel to attend and help explain this issue.

- 2) **Record keeping rule, OAR 811-015-0005.** The OBCE has voted to enter into permanent rulemaking for the purpose of making the minimum requirements for clinical record keeping more explicit. Currently, the Nevada rule language and checklist provided a template for the [LINKED Draft 1](#).
- 3) **Chiropractic Assistants, OAR 811-010-0110.** The OBCE has voted to enter into permanent rulemaking for the purpose of addressing concerns with the CA program, including 1) CAs taking vitals (versus recording them), and 2) CAs who lack sufficient training performing massage; and related scope of practice issues. There is also discussion of a "super CA" certification that could perform some additional functions. [Click here to see memo by OBCE member Dr. Jason Young.](#)
