

NEW PROPOSED RULE: POST-PRIMARY TEMPORARY LICENSE

Submit Comments by September 23

The OBMI is proposing rules to allow current medical imaging licensees to obtain a “post-primary temporary license” in a separate licensure modality, for the explicit purpose of completing clinical requirements to sit for a post-primary national registry examination. This proposal is somewhat similar to the OBMI’s current “provisional” licensure category that is set to expire on December 31, 2013. Under the new proposal, the Board would be able to require confirmation of an applicant’s clinical supervision while practicing under the post-primary license, as well as the applicant’s eligibility for a post-primary registry credential. An OBMI-issued post-primary temporary license would be valid for a maximum of 24 months.

Your comments are welcome and will be considered by the Board. *By law comments must be received in our office no later than September 23 by 4:30 p.m.* The Board is scheduled to consider public comments and vote on whether to approve a new post-primary temporary license category at the October 11th OBMI meeting in Portland.
