

## Oregon Department of Revenue Pilot Project on Compliance

House Bill 3082 was passed during the 2009 Legislative Session, authorizing the Department of Revenue (DOR) to work with licensing regulatory boards on a pilot project to ensure that licensees are in compliance with state tax laws prior to renewing a license.

At the November 5, 2009 Board meeting, the Board directed staff to work with DOR on this Licensee Tax Compliance Pilot Project. This will affect all Board of Tax Practitioner licensees.

Tax compliance for the Pilot Project is defined as having filed personal income tax returns for the past three years. If there was a balance owed, the licensee needs to be adhering to an ongoing payment plan on file with DOR. The balance does not need to be paid in full in order to be considered in compliance.

We encourage all licensees to be in compliance with all tax programs and all filing requirements; however, the Pilot Project will focus only on personal income tax returns and balances due, without looking at whether estimated tax payments are currently being made.
