

Thomas Spies is a Research Ecologist at the USDA Forest Service, Pacific Northwest Research Station, in Corvallis, Oregon, where he is team leader of the Landscapes and Ecosystems Team in the Ecosystem Processes Program. He is also a courtesy professor in the Department of Forest Science in the College of Forestry at Oregon State University. He received his Ph.D. in from the School of Natural Resources at the University of Michigan in 1983. He was a member of the Forest Ecosystem Management Team that developed the Northwest Forest Plan. His research interests include stand dynamics, old-growth forest ecology and conservation, wildlife habitat relationships, and landscape ecology. He is lead editor of a forthcoming book "Old-growth in a New World: Perspectives on forest conservation in the Pacific Northwest" to be published in 2008 by Island Press.
