## **I-84: Exit 64 (Hood River), Bundle 224 Region 1 Notice of Subcontracting Opportunities**

The Oregon Department of Transportation is planning a bridge construction project in ODOT's Region 1 within the next 30 days.

I-84: Exit 64 (Hood River), Bundle 224, is part of ODOT's OTIA III State Bridge Delivery Program. The project consists of the replacement of one bridge (07398) and cross-road improvements at Exit 64 on Interstate 84 in Hood River County.

The cost of this project is estimated to be \$14.9 million. The anticipated construction bid let date is October 2009. It is estimated that construction will be complete in November 2011.

Contracting and subcontracting opportunities are potentially available on Bundle 224. The following is a general list of opportunities typically subcontracted on similar highway construction projects. This list is for reference only, as neither ODOT nor any awarded contractor is obligated to subcontract these specific scopes of work.

- Concrete curb
