The following changes are made to the Project Special Provisions:

1. Subsection 00596.00 Scope - The following bullet item is added after the paragraph that begins "Select a proprietary retaining wall from the following list":
 - SSL (MSE Plus), Tel. (831) 430-9300
2. Subsection 00760.10 Unit Paving Material - The bulleted item that begins with the words "Unit Size" is replaced with the following bullet item:
 - **Unit Size** - Full Stone 8-13/16" to 9"L x 5 7/16" to 6-3/16"W x 2 3/8" T
Edge Stone 8-13/16"L to 9"L x 4-5/16 to 4 1/2"W x 2-3/8" T
3. Subsection 00760.10 Unit Paving Material - The following manufacturer is added after the paragraph that begins "The following manufacturers are pre-approved":

4. Subsection 00290.51 Protection of Sensitive Cultural Sites - This subsection is replaced with the following subsection:

00290.51 Protection of Sensitive Cultural Sites - Add the following to the end of this subsection:

- The project is located in an archaeologically sensitive area. A qualified archaeologist must be on site during all ground disturbing activities. The contractor shall not begin ground disturbing activities until the archaeological monitor is present. If the archaeologist determines that monitoring of an area is not necessary, the archaeologist will coordinate with the Agency Archaeologist prior to leaving the site.
- The Agency Archaeologist for the project is Carolyn McAleer, ODOT Archaeology Program Coordinator, 503-986-3309.
- Provide 10 days notice to the archaeological monitor prior to any ground disturbing activity.

5. Subsection 00290.90 Payment – The following paragraph is added to the end of this subsection:

The archaeological monitor will be provided by the Agency, at no cost to the contractor.

These changes will be included in the Contract for this Project. It is understood that your Bid will be submitted accordingly.
