RULE SUMMARY

ORS 803.560 specifies that a person commits the offense of improper display of validating [registration] stickers if the person owns or drives a vehicle that doesn't display stickers in a manner required by the Department of Transportation. DMV is proposing to adopt OAR 735-032-0036 to set forth the requirements for the display and placement of registration stickers.

Requirements for the display of registration stickers are currently available upon request from DMV and at DMV's website:

Display requirements are also provided with new registration plates and with registration stickers at the time of initial registration (with new license plates), at registration renewal and when replacement stickers are issued. DMV is clarifying these requirements in rule.

A public rulemaking hearing may be requested in writing by 10 or more people, or by an association with 10 or more members, within 21 days following the publication of the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the *Oregon Bulletin* or 28 days from the date Notice was sent to people on the agency mailing list, whichever is later. If sufficient hearing requests are received, the notice of the date and time of the rulemaking hearing must be published in the *Oregon Bulletin* at least 14 days before the hearing.

The agency requests public comment on whether other options should be considered for achieving the rule's substantive goals while reducing the negative economic impact of the rule on business.

Need for the Rule(s): ORS 803.560 specifies that a person commits the offense of improper display of validating [registration] stickers if the person owns or drives a vehicle that doesn't display stickers in a manner required by the Department of Transportation. DMV is proposing to adopt OAR 735-032-0036 to set forth the requirements for the display and placement of registration stickers.

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Documents Relied Upon and where they are available: None
