RULE SUMMARY

Division 75 of chapter 734 of Oregon Administrative Rule limits the movement of over-dimensional mobile homes and modular building units on Oregon's highways. OAR 734-075-0010 previously prohibited movement of manufactured homes wider than 16 feet at the base and 18 feet overall under any circumstance. Since April 24, 2008, a temporary rule has allowed larger units to be moved under some circumstances. This rule amendment makes those provisions permanent.

Representatives of the manufactured home industry argued in favor of the permanent rule to capture significant economic benefit for Oregon and to provide harmonization of the way ODOT deals with all over-dimensional loads. They pointed out that since Division 82 allows movement of non-divisible loads wider than 16 feet at the base and 18 feet overall, fairness requires similar flexibility in Division 75, regulating the movement of manufactured homes.
