UPDATE TO RIGHTS AND CONSEQUENCES • The Implied Consent Combined Report was updated as a result of House Bill 2900 (2003). DMV revised the form to include a statement in Section 1 of the “rights and consequences” portion of the form informing the person of additional consequences of refusing a breath test.

It has come to our attention that some law enforcement agencies are using a tape recorded version of the Implied Consent Combined Report “rights and consequences” portion. This is a reminder to update your tape recorded versions to include the new statement added as a result of HB 2900.

HB 2900 amended ORS 813.130(2) to add “(f) If the person refuses a breath test under ORS 813.100, the person is subject to a fine of at least \$500 and not more than \$1,000.”

ORS CITATIONS FOR NEW OFFENSES • DMV has been receiving calls from law enforcement regarding how to cite a number of new offenses created during the 2003 legislative session. These offenses have now been codified, and can be cited using the statute numbers assigned, as follows:

New Offense	Bill # (2003 Session)	New ORS
Failure to maintain a safe distance from an emergency vehicle or ambulance	HB 2176	811.147
Failure to yield to a traffic patrol member	HB 2422	811.017
Organizing a speed racing event	SB 189	811.127
Refusal to take a breath test	HB 2900	813.095
Violating a speed limit	HB 2661	811.111
