

Title and Register Your Motorcycle or Moped



Use these instructions if you bought a motorcycle or moped.

How to Apply:

Title:

- Fill out an [Application for Title and Registration](#) (Form 735-226);
 - [Help](#) with the application.
- Provide the original ownership document;
- Provide the original [odometer disclosure](#), if required;
- Provide original releases of interest from any previous owners;
 - This is usually provided on ownership document, an original bill of sale, or a Secure Odometer Disclosure/Reassignment. A [Bill of Sale](#) (Form 735-501) may be used.
- Provide original lien releases from any previous security interest holders;
 - This is usually provided on the ownership document, as an original signed letter, or a [Lien Release](#) (Form 735-524).
- Get a [vehicle identification number \(VIN\) inspection](#) for \$7, if required;
- Calculate all applicable title, registration and plate [fees](#); and
 - Registration requirements are listed in the section below if you choose to apply for registration at the same time as your title.
- Submit your completed application, supporting materials, and payment to DMV.

Registration:

- Provide proof of compliance with U.S. standards if your vehicle was imported, is brand new, or is not one of the major manufacturers recognized by DMV; and

❖ Major manufacturers recognized by DMV:

❖ Proof of compliance may be:

- An MCO stating the vehicle meets federal safety and emissions standards;
- A completed [Dealer Certification of Compliance with Federal Emission and Safety Standards](#) (Form 735-7290), if the vehicle was in dealer inventory;
- A letter from the manufacturer stating the vehicle can be modified to meet federal safety and emissions standards with a [Certification of Compliance with Federal Emission and Safety Standards](#) (Form 735-7286);
- DMV viewing the federal safety and EPA labels on the vehicle;
- A U.S. Customs and Border Protection Form CF7501 or CBP7501, or original letter from the manufacturer stating the vehicle meets federal safety and emissions standards; or
- For vehicles imported by the U.S. military or U.S. military personnel, a written notice or form issued by the U.S. military.

Note: Most off-road vehicles cannot be modified for use on Oregon highways and **cannot be registered**.

□ Choose your plates.

- If the vehicle has an Oregon plate, in most cases, you may choose to keep it on the vehicle.
- You may transfer a valid Oregon plate to your vehicle.

By submitting an application for registration, you are certifying:

- You currently have, and will maintain, motor vehicle insurance required by Oregon law for as long as you register the vehicle; and
- Your home is in Oregon; or
- You are eligible, or required, to register under Oregon law.
