

List B: Proof of ID and date of birth – no SSN assigned

Valid U.S. passport

Not expired more than five years

Valid foreign passport

With arrival/departure record (I-94 or CBP I-94A) issued by U.S. Customs and Border Protection, not expired

Not expired

- Resident alien card or permanent resident card (I-551)
- Temporary resident ID card (I-688)
- Employment authorization document (I-688A, I-688B and I-766)
- Certificate of citizenship (N560 and N561)

Not expired

Don't use false ID documents

All identification and birth documents must be original or certified copies from the issuing agency. DMV has the discretion to require additional evidence of identity and date of birth. It is a crime to present altered or forged documents or to make a false statement to DMV when applying for a driver license, permit or ID card, and is punishable by a fine and up to a year in prison (ORS: 25.990, 807.530, 809.310).

Frequent questions

When do the new rules take effect?

Feb. 4, 2008.

How do they affect current card holders?

Current Oregon driver licenses and ID cards will be valid until renewal or replacement.

Do I need my Social Security card?

No. You can just write your number on your application or verbally give your number to the DMV representative.

DMV asked for my SSN the last time I renewed. What is different now?

DMV has been collecting Social Security numbers for all drivers since Jan. 1, 2004. However, an SSN has not been required for issuance of an ID card. The new rules require DMV to verify SSNs for all drivers and ID card applicants.

How long does it take to verify an SSN?

Seconds. The verification is done electronically as DMV staff complete other parts of your transaction.

I can't get an SSN without photo ID. What can I do?

A complete list of documents the Social Security Administration will accept for the purpose of issuing an SSN can be obtained by contacting SSA at 1-800-772-1213 or www.socialsecurity.gov.

DMV cannot verify my SSN. What do I do?

You will need to work with the Social Security Administration to resolve the problem. Customers may contact SSA at 1-800-772-1213 or www.socialsecurity.gov.

Oregon Identification Requirements

What has changed

Oregon DMV requirements for proof of identity have tightened as of Feb. 4, 2008.

All applicants for first-time, renewal or replacement driver licenses, instruction permits or ID cards must provide a **verifiable Social Security number and at least one acceptable proof of identity and date of birth** document from DMV's List A at the time of application.

Impact on current card holders

Under these new rules, current holders of Oregon driver licenses, permits and ID cards do not need to take any action until they renew or replace their cards. Also, the SSN check is not made when customers file a change of address within Oregon.

If DMV can't verify your SSN

If DMV cannot verify your Social Security number, DMV will not issue a driver license, permit or ID card. You will need to contact the Social Security Administration at www.socialsecurity.gov or 1-800-772-1213.

If you don't have an SSN

Applicants for a Class C non-commercial driver license or instruction permit or an ID card who never have been issued a Social Security number must sign a **Statement of No Social Security Number** and provide **at least one acceptable identity and date of birth** document from DMV's List B at the time of application.

Other licensing requirements

These new requirements are in addition to payment of test and application fees, proof of residence in Oregon, and passage of tests – such as the driver knowledge, vision and driving tests.

Driver license, instruction permit or ID card

Must contain applicant's photo

- Oregon, not expired more than one year
- Out-of-state, District of Columbia, U.S. territorial government or Canada, not expired or expired no more than 60 days

Immigrant visa issued by the

Not expired

Must contain the stamp *"Upon endorsement serves as temporary I-551 evidencing permanent residence for one year"*

U.S. Department of State driver license or non-driver ID card

Not expired more than 60 days

Oregon concealed weapon permit concealed handgun license

Not expired more than one year

Confederated Tribes of Oregon Tribal ID card
