For Ex-POW plates, a prisoner of war is defined as being a person who, while serving in the active military, naval or air service of the U.S. or any of its Allies, was forcibly detained or interned in the line of duty by:

- An enemy government, its agents or a hostile force during a period of war; or
- A foreign government, its agents or hostile forces under circumstances similar to periods of war.

You must provide proof of POW status. Proof can be any of the following:

- A letter from Veterans Affairs, Department of Defense, or an Armed Forces Branch of Service verifying your POW status; or
- · A Military Medical ID Card showing POW status; or
- If an Ally, proof that you were a POW and that the country was a U.S. Ally at the time of the internment.

I certify that:

- I qualify as a prisoner of war, as defined above; and
- This vehicle is not a commercial vehicle with a loaded weight over 10,000 pounds; and
- No other vehicle owned by me or a member of my household has been registered with Ex-POW plates.

I understand it is a crime under ORS 803.385 to certify the truth of a statement when I know it is not true. Such a crime is a Class A misdemeanor and is punishable by a jail sentence of up to 1 year, a fine of up to \$6.250 or both.
