

Project Information & Benefits

- Minor arterial in City of Turner
- County-maintained road within the city
- City project being delivered by county, city providing match and non-participating costs
- County is funding overlay of existing travel lanes
- Project will construct bike lanes and sidewalk and improve railroad crossing
- Currently pedestrians and cyclists use gravel shoulder or vehicular travel lane



Delaney Road Bicycle & Pedestrian Improvements




North Side – Larger Setback

Parking Lane Needed




Delaney Road Typical Cross-Section

DELANEY RD: 7TH ST TO 6TH ST




*PLANTER STRIP WHERE RIGHT-OF-WAY IS AVAILABLE
