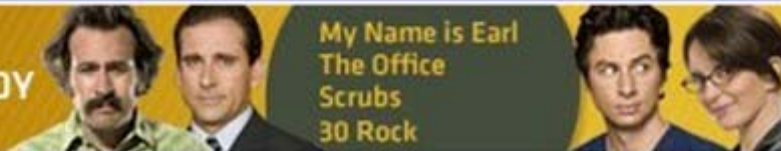

Roadwork continues to disrupt summer traffic all around southern Oregon.

For the next three months major construction is taking place on local portions of state and federal highways.

The Oregon Department of Transportation says the work will last up to three years and will cause congestion.

In Ashland, a three-mile stretch of highway 99 is now undergoing re-paving through August.

If that isn't enough for motorists, re-routing of highland drive traffic at Barnett Road also began Monday.

There are more than four hundred work-zone related traffic accidents with around ten deaths per year in Oregon. Be advised, traffic fines are double in work zones.
