GRANTS PASS ODOT to boost work force

The Oregon Department of Transportation is looking to expand the number of minorities and women in highway construction trades.

ODOT is forming a Regional Workforce Alliance to increase apprenticeship and training in the southwestern part of the state. Its first meeting is 12:30 p.m. Tuesday at Rogue Community College's Redwood Campus, cafeteria back room, 3345 Redwood Highway, Grants Pass.
