

US 26: Wildwood –Wemme Project Utility Inventory and Coordination

Utility Coordination

The following table lists the utilities involved in gathering existing utility data and assessing impacts. Five utilities would generate no relocation costs, either because they have no facilities nearby, or because their utility is co-located with other utilities.

Cost Assumptions

This section describes the assumptions used in the cost estimation process.

- All effected utilities are in ODOT ROW by permit.
- ODOT will not share in the relocation cost.
- Existing ROW is sufficient for utility relocation.
- Storm drainage system is an ODOT facility.

Power

Power lines along Hwy 26 supply power to the overall power grid. These power lines are located along the South ODOT ROW and are not expected to be impacted by widening. There may be impacts to pole locations on the South ROW based on access control measures at the Whistle Stop Restaurant and other locations not yet identified.

Two lines that crossover the highway and feed power to the residential area on the North side of the highway will be impacted in all options except a no-build option. The relocation effort will be limited to relocating two poles to maintain overhead clearance for lines crossing Highway 26.

Storm Sewers

Storm drain lines would be impacted by the project, but are not included in relocation costs. These lines, inlets, and culverts drain water only from ODOT facilities and do not transmit stormwater from other sources. The relocation of such facilities is a facet of the roadway design rather than utility relocation.

Communication Cable

There are buried cables on the North side of Hwy 26 that will be impacted by all options except a no build-option. Storm water retention facilities or improvements to Latarelle Ave., Mountain Air Drive and East Wildwood Ave. could impact these cables. Access control measures may impact cables at the Mountain Air Motel.
