WEEKEND LANE AND RAMP WORK

Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) maintenance crews will temporarily close lanes and ramps on several ODOT owned roads this weekend. Closure dates, locations and hours are listed below.

Interstate 405

Saturday, March 18, crews will close one lane of 16th Avenue at the Everett Street off-ramp from southbound I-405. The single lane closure will be in place from 6 a.m. to 11 a.m. to allow workers to repair a section of guardrail. The Everett Street off-ramp from southbound I-405 will remain open.

Interstate 205

Saturday, March 18, crews will close the right lane of southbound I-205 from the Stafford Road on-ramp, milepost 3.16, to just west of the Washington County/Clackamas County line, approximately milepost 1.0. The Stafford Road on-ramp to southbound I-205 will also be closed. The lane and ramp closures will be in place from 9 p.m. to 7 a.m. Workers will make pavement repairs. During the overnight ramp closure period, motorists headed for southbound I-205 from Stafford Road will take northbound I-205 to the 10th Street interchange and then follow the signs to southbound I-205.

Interstate 5

Sunday, March 19, crews will close the ramp from southbound I-5 to eastbound I-84 from 5 a.m. to 10 a.m. for electrical work. During the ramp closure period, motorists headed for eastbound I-84 will take I-5 south to the Morrison Bridge/City Center off-ramp, left at the Belmont/Morrison Bridge split on the ramp, left onto Grand Avenue and then follow Grand Avenue north to the I-84 east on-ramp.

Macadam Avenue ramp

Sunday, March 19, workers will close a portion of the ramp from northbound Macadam Avenue to southbound Hood Avenue from 6 a.m. to 8 a.m. for concrete work. Access to I-5 south, Hood Avenue and the eastbound Ross Island Bridge will be maintained.

U.S. 26 (Sunset Highway)

Sunday, March 19, workers will close the right lane of westbound U.S. 26 at the Glencoe Road interchange to complete concrete work. The right lane closure will be in place from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m.
