### Project Background

Interstate 84 at the 257th Ave. interchange (Exit 17) is an important freeway connection to many industrial businesses at the eastern end of the Columbia industrial corridor. This project, in the City of Troutdale in Multnomah County, will improve safety and capacity in the area of the I-84/257th Ave. interchange. It is funded by Oregon House Bill 2001 (the Jobs and Transportation Act — JTA).

### Project Description

In 2009, a project funded by ODOT, Port of Portland, City of Troutdale and federal stimulus funds added an additional turn lane for traffic headed east on South Frontage Road to 257th Ave./NW Graham Rd. and was completed in 2009.

Elements funded by the JTA in the current project beginning in May include:

- widening the I-84 eastbound exit ramp, and improving the intersection
- adding a third lane to South Frontage Road
- improving the intersection at the I-84 westbound exit ramp and Graham Road, including adding a third lane to a portion of North Frontage Road

### Construction Impacts

Most of the widening work on the Frontage Roads will take place on ODOT property adjacent to I-84, but motorists should expect intermittent lane closures on the Frontage Roads during daytime work hours.

The I-84 east and west exit ramps will be closed for several nights during this project to allow for the ramp widening work. During the nighttime closures, motorists can follow signed detour routes to reach their destination. The detour route maps are posted on the project website. Nighttime work will create some noise along the ramps and Frontage Roads.

### Future Improvements

ODOT plans to begin design work this summer on a future project to make Marine Drive a two-way road where it passes under I-84. Check the website for more information as project development begins.
