




# Oregon

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## OR99W: Lake Slough Bridge



### **Project location**

This project is located on OR99W south of Monroe near Schultz Road.

### **Project purpose**

The purpose of this project is to replace the bridge.

### **Project Description**

The project will replace the Lake Slough Bridge located on OR99W south of Monroe at MP 103.68. The bridge is a two span reinforced concrete deck girder bridge built in 1919. It is an old bridge and in deteriorating condition.

### **Why the project is needed**

This bridge has been in service for 94 years. The bridge was load tested in September 2012, and the results of the load test showed that heavier truck traffic should be restricted. In the June 2013 bridge inspection, the superstructure was given a condition rating of "Fair".

This bridge is on an important freight route that can serve as a back-up to I-5, and also is used for permit loads that are over height and cannot use I-5.

### **Current Status**

- The bridge is being inspected on a monthly basis to ensure its continued serviceability,
- Development of the project will begin in summer of 2013, with construction planned for 2016.

**Cost estimate**

The total estimated cost is about \$2.52 million.
