PROJECT UPDATE



- On June 15 the City Council viewed a presentation on the design options for the Nelscott business strip and listened to testimony from the community. The city council then voted on June 22 for the drive-through design option which is similar to what exists in Nelscott today. The vote allows the project team to move forward with more detailed design elements. A copy of the city council presentation will be posted on the project's web site.

- Funding is a significant discussion as we move forward and we start to look at design details.

Five lanes are needed in order to ease congestion on U.S. 101; the cost of building five lanes is approximately \$19.4 million more than the project has.

Because of the funding shortfall, the next step is to create a facility plan for five lanes. Upon completion of the facility plan, we will discuss how to phase in the project and identify what is built with the funds we have.

We will keep sending updates to CAC members on the progress of the project and will let CAC members know when the next CAC meeting will take place. We do not have an anticipated date for the next meeting.
