Project location

- Located on Hwy 99 (also known as 6th and 7th Streets) in Eugene, from Roosevelt Blvd., MP 121.14, to Garfield St., 122.19.

Project purpose and need

- Pavement is failing

Construction overview

- Pavement preservation project. Concrete panels that exist under a portion of the roadway will be removed, and the entire road width will be reconstructed, using 11" of aggregate and 11" of AC. In some areas additional materials may need to be removed and additional rock placed to get a stable surface upon which to place the pavement. The structure over the railroad tracks will receive a waterproof membrane and resurfacing of the deck. Concrete medians will be replaced. This is needed to accommodate traffic movement during construction.
- One lane of traffic will be under construction throughout the project and one lane occupied by construction workers and equipment. Traffic will be reduced to one lane in each direction. Construction will take place during both day and night time hours to reduce the amount of time that traffic is impacted.
- Customer access to businesses will be provided at all times. Businesses with more than one access may have the number of accesses reduced during construction.
- Traffic will not be detoured, but an alternate route will be signed.
- The project is to be constructed within the existing footprint. No additional R/W is needed.
- Water quality will be improved by re-contouring the grass median area that lies north of the convergence of 6th and 7th Streets and directing the highway stormwater to the median via curb cuts, allowing the water to filter through the grass prior to entering the City stormwater system.

Cost estimate

- Estimated construction cost is \$6M.
- Funded by federal and state preservation dollars.

Key project milestones

- Project will bid on May 5, 2011, for construction summer of 2011.
