

## US 97: Algoma Rd. – Miller Island Rd.

*Last Updated: September 20, 2016*



### Project overview

- Repave approximately twelve miles of US 97 between North Chiloquin Interchange (MP 247) to Modoc Point (MP257) and Algoma Rd. (MP 265) to Shady Pine Rd. (MP 267).

### Why this project is needed

US Highway 97 is classified as an Expressway and is a critical part of the State's transportation system. The highway carries a high volume of freight and recreational traffic between California and Washington. Trucks make up 40 percent of the total traffic volume in this section of US 97. Keeping roads in good condition and providing for safe travel are critical parts of the mission for the Oregon Department of Transportation.

These sections of US 97 are in poor condition, showing extensive cracking, rutting and other deterioration. These problems are causing safety and operational issues and needs to be addressed in order to minimize further deterioration.

### How ODOT plans to solve these problems

These sections of US 97 will be repaved with a 2" grind and inlay to remove the failing road surface. Once paving is complete, durable striping and signs will be replaced.

### Traffic Control during Construction

Motorists can expect delays during paving operations. Single lane closures with traffic controlled by flaggers and a pilot car is expected during evening and nighttime work hours.

Contract bid let: January 2018  
Construction: Summer 2018

#### *Estimated Project Cost*

\$4.7 million
