Reports

Data Sharing/Licensing Agreement:

Cy reports "In terms of the data license, I just got word today that Deschutes has signed and I'll have that one in a day or two. And I have a signed agreement with Clatsop. It appears that Polk, Columbia, Wasco, Clackamas, Lane, and Multnomah won't have problems signing, just will take a bit of time. That leaves Tillamook and Lincoln. Not sure where Tillamook is with this since Teri left, not sure who to contact at this point. Lincoln is working it but John Waffenschmidt isn't sure how it's going to go. I have an agreement with Revenue that once these 11 are resolved, the tax lot data will be released to state agencies. And following OGIC's and PAC's urging, I have contacted every other county, except Grant for which I have no contact, to ask if they want a license in place. Haven't heard from any of them yet, after over a week."

COCC IGA:

ODOT has worked up another IGA with Central Oregon Community College for the next biennium. This will fund gis data creation for Tillamook County, however, it is amendable for additional work. We have the IGA to COCC and they have reviewed it and we are waiting for signatures from COCC.

Washington State effort:

Two proposals came in, one from Terra Genesis and one from Gray Hill. Both proposals were not accepted and the WA-TRANS group decided to use an existing contract with ESRI to work on developing code for the pilot data translator in the Pierce/King County area in Washington.

Tillamook County Coordination:

Coordination is sort of at a stand still. Teri did, however, suggest that we go a head with data development as per the specifications she gave that would meet the County needs. Specifically she gave some thresholds for accuracy in urban-rural-resource areas and a list of attributes. I will have more to update you on when we get the IGA with COCC going.

Census effort:

I will be meeting with Rick Campbell at Census before GPL next week. I have asked if he would provide a list of all the counties Census has assessed for accuracy and list whether they past the accuracy test. I will let folks know when I find out. Since the last meeting we have decided that the Census time frame for developing data is farther out than the timeline for when we need the OTN data, so we will be working to finish all of

the county datasets left (there are some private and county efforts right now to build data too) hopefully by the end of the year for geometry and some of the attributes and by the end of 2008 for all the addressing and edge matching.

Data Loading in All Roads:

We are ramping up to get the rest of the data into the database. We only have a couple months left to do this. We have a few datasets that we are waiting to get back from GeoSolve and once we do we can move forward quickly.

GeoSolve:

Based on the schedule I got from OEM earlier this year, the counties that we have developed data in (Malheur, Harney, Lake, Baker) will be forwarded to GeoSolve for work on addressing through the OEM address project. The three additional counties we are working to get done by the end of the year (Coos, Grant and Klamath), Grant and Klamath will be forwarded to GeoSolve for addressing.

Contracts and progress

BLM:

BLM has finished their first contract for Malheur, Harney, Lake and Baker. We now have an amendment for them to work on Klamath and Coos. They should be finished before the end of the year..

U of O contract/work:

UofO has completed Wallowa County they will now begin work on Grant County and that should be done by the end of the year.

COCC Contract:

We have sent an IGA to COCC and they have reviewed it and had a couple clarifications on the terms. Those were resolved and we are waiting for signatures. Once that occurs we will have COCC begin work on the Tillamook County project that I had coordinated with Teri Gaffney on.

Curry County IGA:

Toni Fisher reports (as of the 15th of Sept) they are waiting for imagery in the eastern part of the county once they have those images they will continue work.
