

Roadside Hazards (1 to 2 hours)

This class includes a pictorial awareness presentation of various hazards and a discussion of a simple inventory and correction process.

HAZMAT Awareness Refresher (2 hours)

This training is geared toward public works employees who may come across the scene of a hazardous materials or potential terrorist incident in the course of their work. It is intended to provide refresher training for those who have already taken the Hazardous Materials Awareness course. Awareness level training prepares participants to identify a hazardous materials spill, notify proper authorities, and stay safe until help arrives. The course also explains the roles of other response personnel at a hazardous materials or terrorist incident.

Emergency Bridge Inspection (2 hours)

This class teaches public works workers how to inspect a bridge after a seismic or other event that may have caused damage to a bridge. It also includes how to determine if a bridge is safe and how to report the results of the inspection.

Hearing Protection (1½ to 2 hours)

This class is condensed from a course offered to ODOT employees. It covers basic hearing protection techniques and hearing protection tools.

Sleep Deprivation (1 to 1½ hours)

Learn the basic causes of sleep deprivation and how it affects physical behavior.

Oregon T2 Center's Training Program



The purpose of the Oregon Technology Transfer (T2) Center is to help local transportation agencies obtain information and training on transportation technology relating to roads, bridges and public transportation. The following training classes are available to local agencies at no cost. Training is provided on-site at the requesting agency's facility.

[Safe Forklift Operation \(3 to 4 hours\)](#)

This is a forklift safety awareness class and operator skill evaluations. The training and evaluation is provided by T2 to aid public agencies in satisfying the OR-OSHA requirement that employers certify the competency of operators. The classroom portion is 2 hours and employs videos, group discussion, and a written test. Following the classroom session, each attendee is evaluated on their proficiency in operating the forklift. A record of the evaluation will be provided the employer for the operator's training file.



Please note: This class is for experienced operators. It is not operator training.

[Pre-Trip Inspection \(4 hours\)](#)

This class provides in-depth coverage of the commercial vehicle pre-trip inspection that is required by the USDOT Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations. The class introduces and guides the students through a Commercial Driver License (CDL) based checklist of the key vehicle locations that must be inspected prior to operation. The class consists of approximately 2½ hours of classroom time and 1½ hours for a vehicle walk around.

[Equipment Tie-Down \(4 hours\)](#)

This class covers important Federal and State Motor Carrier Requirements pertaining to equipment tie-downs. The 2½ hour classroom session covers the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration rules on Protection Against Shifting and Falling Cargo and wraps up with a class exercise. The training then moves outdoors and concludes with a 1½ hour field exercise.



[Coaching the Maintenance Vehicle Operator \(3 to 4 hours\)](#)

This course is designed for experienced operators who understand the basics of handling their vehicles; whether they are dump trucks, loaders or other maintenance vehicles. The goal is to prevent collisions and injuries by focusing on safe driving procedures that the operator can realistically use in daily driving. The course employs videos, a workbook and group discussion. **Certificate awarded.**

[Defensive Driving \(2 to 4 hours\)](#)

This course is designed for drivers who are already skilled in the basics of handling a vehicle. The objective of the course is to review and build on current driving skills and help drivers reach a new level of defensive driving. The class employs videos, a workbook and group discussion. **Certificate awarded.**

[Public Agency Work Zone Traffic Control \(4 hours\)](#)

This class covers the basics of temporary traffic control for the protection of maintenance and utility work areas. The program covers Federal and State standards including the fundamental principles of traffic control from both part VI of the MUTCD and the Oregon Temporary Traffic Control Handbook.



[Drug and Alcohol Awareness for Commercial Drivers \(1 to 1½ hours\)](#)

This class covers the USDOT rules on drug and alcohol use by CDL holders.. Topics include mandatory testing, how test samples are collected, the effects of the specifically prohibited drugs, and driver and agency rights and responsibilities. The class satisfies the USDOT requirements through the use of videos, a workbook, and group discussion. **Certificate awarded.**

[Drug and Alcohol Awareness for Supervisors of Commercial Drivers \(1½ to 2 hours\)](#)

This class provides supervisors of CDL holders the USDOT required minimum training in drug and alcohol abuse awareness. Attendees are shown how to recognize and challenge drug and alcohol use in the workplace. The class satisfies the USDOT requirements through the use of videos, a workbook, and group discussion. **Certificate awarded.**



[Roadside Design \(3 to 4 hours\)](#)

This class is an introduction to and discussion of material applicable to both highways and low volume roads, condensed from the two day National Highway Institute's course titled "Roadside Design Guide.
