


The purpose of the Medical Certification Program is to ensure that a person is safe to drive a motor vehicle on public roads through periodic certification by their physician after a physical examination. This information is sent to DMV who sends it to the State Health Office for a determination that is returned to the customer.

The re-examination evaluation program evaluates drivers whose driving behavior has been reported to this agency for action by law enforcement, courts, and other reliable sources. The driver meets privately with a DMV representative for an overall evaluation of their mental status, comprehension, knowledge of the rules of the road, and their behind-the-wheel driving skills.

The Crash Analysis & Reporting Unit captures and codes motor vehicle involved crashes reported to DMV from citizen reports, police reports. Crash data includes ODOT public roadway inventory information. It is maintained and provided through data collection and analysis, database creation, maintenance and quality assurance. Motor vehicle crashes included are those occurring on public roads, city streets, county roads, and state highways. Crash information, reports, data extracts, and GIS data is available by request. Due to the high volume of data requests, to ensure meeting deadlines, please request data at least two weeks in advance. Ten years of crash data is maintained at all times.

The Impaired Driving Program provides overtime grants to law enforcement agencies through OSP, OSSA and Oregon Impact to enhance DUII patrols in cities, counties and across the state. Funding is also provided for administration and training related to the Drug Recognition Expert Program and DPSST for DUII arrest procedures. The Impaired Driving Program also works with DOJ and ODAA to develop and coordinate training and education for prosecutors, judges and law enforcement, along with funding specialty treatment courts specifically dealing with DUII. The program works extensively with partner agencies and organizations to develop effective DUII policy and legislation relating to prevention,

treatment, adjudication, monitoring offenders, and licensing. Public education and awareness media campaigns are also developed through this program.
