Brief Summary of Readmission Rates of Adult Patients

We estimate that 40-50% of those who are admitted to OSH as civil or criminal commitments will eventually be readmitted to OSH. We similarly estimate that 30% of those who are admitted to OSH as other commitments will eventually be readmitted to OSH.

About 72% of those who were admitted to OSH between 1/1/2000 and 12/31/2008 (as civil, criminal, hospital holds, aid and assists, or other) were admitted to OSH only once in that time frame. About 17% were admitted twice, and the remaining 11% were admitted 3 or more times.

The following data is for residents who were originally in the Oregon State Hospital (OSH) and then were readmitted to the OSH.

Secure Residential Treatment Facility Residents

- Civilly committed about 5% will be transferred back to OSH.
- Criminally committed about 12% will be transferred back to OSH.
- Other commitments about 10% will be transferred back to OSH.

Residential Treatment Facility Residents

- Civilly committed about 4% will be transferred to OSH.
- Criminally committed about 21% will be transferred back to OSH.
- Other commitments about 4% will be transferred to OSH.

Residential Treatment Home Residents

- Civilly committed about 6% will be transferred back to OSH.
- Criminally committed about 31% will be transferred back to OSH.
- Other commitments about 15% will be transferred back to OSH.

Adult Foster Home Residents

- Civilly committed about 2% will be transferred to OSH.
- Criminally committed about 22% will be transferred back to OSH.
- Other commitments about 8% will be transferred back to OSH.
