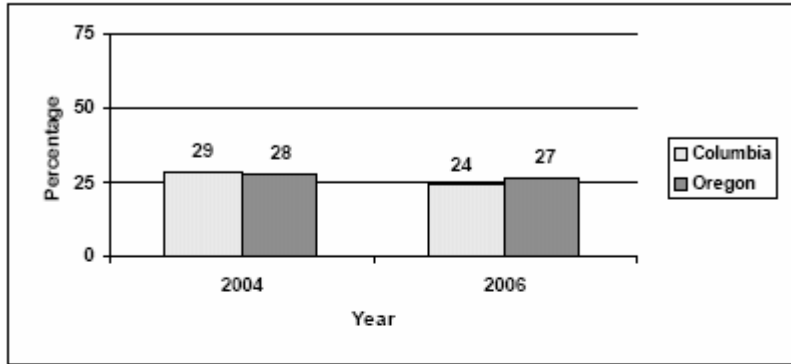

Percent of Youth Who Gambled in the Past Year

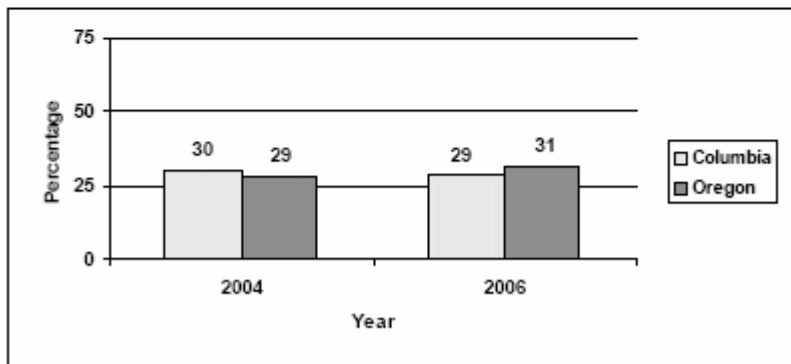
8th grade

Youth who gamble are much more likely to be involved in other risky behaviors.

Gambling should be included in discussions of healthy choices and risky behaviors at school, in the community and at home.
