As well as an overview of the system strengths. • Step two is a description and explanation of the data collection systems that we use to identify service needs and system gaps. As well as a description of those unmet needs and service gaps. • Step three is a list of priorities with descriptions. The priorities are not listed in any particular order. • Step four is the specific steps AMH will use to address each priority. There needs to be at least one goal per priority but there can be more. For several of our priorities there is more than one goal listed.
