

## Portland State University Review of Year One

### Statewide Children's Wraparound Initiative 2010-2011

1. Successes in Implementation:

- Development and training of Wraparound Teams, inclusive of Family Partners, who now have foundational facilitation skills, and are moving into advanced facilitation skill-building in Year Two.
- Broad initial wave of education of many System Partners with regard to both Wraparound and System of Care.
- Excellent use and/or creation of Advisory and Leadership Councils to support the development and promotion of a comprehensive System of Care.
- Advancement of Family and Youth Voice at the practice and system level, and foundational work on Cultural and Linguistic issues.
- Several excellent pilots to advance integration of Wraparound into various systems, i.e. BRS work.

2. Challenges in Implementation:

- Challenges inherent in bringing some system partners to the table at the local and State level for greater orientation, relationship-building, training, collaboration, transformation.
- Some cultural/system resistance to elevating Family/Youth Voice.
- CSWI indicates further work is needed at the Cultural and Linguistic level.
- Ongoing challenges related to funding.

3. Next Steps and Needs:

- Continue to advance skill level of Wrap Teams at the practice level.
- Continue to engage/orient more distant system partners; broaden focus from Wraparound to Wrap and Systems of Care approach.
- Support ongoing Cultural and Linguistic needs within communities of practice.
- Continue to support the advancement of Family and Youth Voice at practice and system level.
- Intersection of System of Care principles and philosophy with Integrated Health Care, Differential Response, other State initiatives, models, services.
