 BRS Levels of Care

Service	Description of Program and Population Served
BRS/ICC	BRS Intensive Community Care (ICC) provides placement options for children in DHS custody or voluntarily placed with DHS that also meet criteria for Intensive Service Array (ISA) through a Mental Health Organization. BRS ICC targets the population of children with mental health needs that are not severe enough to qualify for Psychiatric Residential Treatment Services (PRTS), yet too severe for traditional BRS placements. This program will provide highly structured living environments with foster parents that are specially trained in providing for the needs of youth with significant mental health and behavioral problems. Children placed in these homes will also receive ICTS services as identified in their mental health Service Coordination plan.
BRS Residential	<p>Provides 24-hour staffed secured services in a residential facility.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Males and females ages 13 and older with behavioral and emotional issues • Males and females 13 and older with borderline IQ • Pregnant and/or parenting females ages 12 and older • Males 13 and older with sexually aggressive behaviors(excluding Eastern Region)
BRS Residential with Link	Provides 24-hour short-term staffed secured services in a residential facility paired with community based therapeutic foster care placement for girls, ages 13 and older.
BRS/ETFC	<p>Provides BRS services utilizing community based therapeutic foster care as the placement option.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Services males 13 and older who require specialized treatment for their sexually aggressive behaviors. • Services for males and females 13 and older with behavioral and emotional problems and borderline IQ.
BRS/TFC	<p>Provides BRS services utilizing community based therapeutic foster care as the placement option.</p> <p>BRS/TFC services both males and females ages 6 and older. Includes some programs developed specifically for children with a borderline intellectual functioning.</p>
BRS/ILS	Provides BRS services by utilizing either a facility based or community based therapeutic foster care for males and females 16 and older who require specialized programming to acquire independent living skills.
BRS Shelter	Provides short term placement services utilizing a residential facility or community based foster care. Placement for males and females ages 10 and older that need assessment and stabilization in a structured setting.
