**GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE—**

- Local level with a minimum of one county jurisdiction
- State level is made up of a “Children’s Cabinet” much like the structure of the current Commission on Children and Families where state-wide policy issues and financing are determined/committed

**LOCAL GOVERNANCE—**

- Minimum size: one county
- Authority: local policy, community assets inclusion, build partnerships
- Design: “Board of Directors” Model including:
  - Families/Youth at 51% of membership
  - Education
  - Child Welfare
  - Juvenile Justice
  - Oregon Youth Authority
  - Developmental Disabilities
  - Early Intervention
  - Public Health
  - Licensed Health Practitioners
  - Business
  - Faith/Culture Communities
  - Hospitals
  - Courts
  - Mental Health
  - Alcohol & Drug
- Should have an Executive Council for nimble decision-making
- Responsible for oversight of financial/policy/management
- Need relationship w/the State: data systems, outcome review, technical assistance for accomplishment of goals, accountability, universal standards
- Need correct level of leadership
- Advisory councils or sub/working committee structure
- Budgetary decisions are the purview of those agents contributing the funds to a blended pool?
