Subject: Temporary Administrative Rules

The Oregon Health Licensing Agency (Agency) filed temporary administrative rules with the Secretary of State Office on September 13, 2011, to align the Agency and the Board of Cosmetology (Board) with correct statutory authority related to assessing civil penalties and aligning rules with American with Disabilities Act protocols related to communicable disease status for certificate holder.

Temporary administrative rules will expire on March 11, 2012.
