The Sex Offender Treatment Board Rules Committee met March 20, 2009, at 10:56 am at the Oregon Health Licensing Agency (OHLA), Rhoades Conference Room, 700 Summer Street NE, Salem, Oregon. The purpose of the meeting was to allow input from stakeholders on the Adult, Developmentally Disabled and Juvenile Treatment Plan Models. Treatment models were made available on the agency Web site for review.

Trampus Schuck explained the Administrative rulemaking process and presented the proposed rulemaking schedule.

- May 1, 2009 Board Meeting approval of proposed rule and fiscal impact assessment
- June 1, 2009 Notice of Proposed Rulemaking published in Oregon Bulletin
- September 4, 2009 Last Day for Public Comment
- September 4, 2009 Tentative Public Rule Hearing - Bert Krages, Administrative Law Judge
- October 23, 2009 Board Meeting approve permanent administrative rules
- November 1, 2009 Permanent Administrative Rules effective

Donald Didier provided an opportunity for public to comment on Juvenile Treatment Model. No public comment was received.

Didier provided an opportunity for public to comment on Developmentally Disabled Treatment Model. Brad Dehler asked if there would be recommended training regarding the treatment plans. Committee members said that a list of recommended training would be made available to licensees.

The committee discussed the changes to the Developmentally Disabled Treatment Model submitted by Gary Blasingame. Committee members agreed that the changes were accurate and requested they be integrated into to the Developmentally Disabled Treatment Model prior to rulemaking. There was no opposition to the changes.

Schuck stated a report with recommendations would be made at the May 1, 2009, board meeting.
