

Did You Know the...

Simplest way to reduce the cost of your medications is to select generic drugs.

Always ask your doctor to write your prescription to allow for the use of a generic substitute.

Value- generic medications offer quality, safety, and effectiveness, at a significantly lower cost.

Inquire with your doctor to determine if there is a generic drug which is appropriate to treat your condition.

New generic drugs are continually becoming available. Ask your doctor or pharmacist at **each** visit if a generic is available.

Generic medications are *FDA-approved & contain the same *active* ingredients as their brand name counterparts.

Splitting tablets (when safe & appropriate) may offer additional savings. Ask your doctor or pharmacist if cutting a higher strength tablet in half to get your daily dose of medication is a possible option for you. This reduces the total # of pills you purchase.

- Purchasing generics when possible generally assures you of the best price and the best discount.
