Your recent response to an AARP mailing indicated that you might be eligible to participate in the State of Oregon's new Prescription Drug Program.

On your behalf, AARP has generously agreed to work with the State of Oregon to make this program a reality. By absorbing some of the implementation costs of printing and mailing AARP is helping the State of Oregon bring this opportunity to you sooner than might otherwise have been possible.

Please take a moment and review the eligibility requirements on the enclosed State application form. If you still meet these requirements, sign the form and return it in the enclosed envelope. There is no obligation or requirement for you to join AARP or any other organization or program. This is not an AARP membership benefit or program.

The Oregon Prescription Drug Program was created by Oregon Senate Bill 875. It is a voluntary program without an annual fee. It is my hope to continue the program at no cost to you. However if a nominal annual fee ever becomes necessary you have no obligation to remain in the program.
