## **OLCC Commissioners issue 17 sanctions to businesses and approves Lakeside liquor store**

**PORTLAND, Ore.** – At their monthly meeting March 16 the commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission ratified the following sanctions based on stipulated settlements:

**Beijing House**, 510 N. Riverside, Medford; will serve a 30-day liquor license suspension for a history of serious and persistent problems involving disturbances, unlawful activities or noise either in the premises or involving patrons of the establishment in the immediate vicinity including public drunkenness, fights, altercations, harassment and public urination. Licensee is Huang Zhu, Inc.; Yong Chao Huang and Susan Chan Huang, corporate principals.

**Fireside Lounge**, 343 NW 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Redmond; will pay a fine of \$5,940 or serve a 36-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation was for permitting two minors to buy, be served or drink alcoholic beverages on the licensed premises. The second violation was for permitting two minors to be in an area of the licensed premises that is prohibited to minors. Licensee is BLD, Inc.; Leonard Duval and Barbara Duval, corporate principals

**Camino Real Family Mexican Restaurant**, 308 Trade Street S, Amity; will pay a fine of \$1,815 or serve an 11-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when she reasonably appeared to be under 26 years old. The second violation is for failing to have staff on the licensed premises who could communicate effectively with Commission employees during the licensees' business hours. Licensee will install age verification equipment and will use the equipment to verify the age of every patron who reasonably appears under 26 years old. Licensees are Fernando Fuentes and Micaela Aguirre.

**River Bend Bar & Grill**, 802 Willow Street, Spray; will serve a 30-day liquor license suspension for failing to maintain liquor liability insurance or a bond with a corporate surety. They will also pay a fine of \$1,155 or serve a seven-day liquor license suspension for failing to meet the food service requirements for a Full On-Premises Sales license. Licensee is River Bend Bar & Grill, LLC; Barbara Richmond-Harris and John Harris, members.

**Stayton Market & Deli**, 991 North 1<sup>st</sup> Ave., Stayton; will serve a 51-day liquor license suspension for two violations. The first violation is for knowingly allowing a person to obtain an interest in the licensed business without prior approval by the Commission. The second violation is for making a false representation or statement to the Commission in order to induce or prevent action by the Commission when the licensee submitted a license renewal application. Licensee is Sarbjit Johal.

For an employee(s) failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing him/her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he/she reasonably appeared to be under 26:

**Flying Eagle Market & Videos**, 14406 Highway 62, Eagle Point; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensees will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensees are Shawn Oman and Bridget Oman.

**Neighborhood Market**, 173 South Pacific Highway, Monmouth; will pay a \$1,485 fine or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensee is Simran, Inc.; Harnek Dhote, corporate principal.

**Pine Cone Tavern**, 629 Chetco Ave., Brookings; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee will also be removed from the Responsible Vendor Program. Licensees are Danielle Kitchel and Dale Lowcock.

**Old World Deli**, 341 SW Second Street, Corvallis; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is OWD, Inc.; Theodore Cox, corporate principal.

**Wasabi Japanese Restaurant**, 820 Crater Lake Avenue #107, Medford; will pay a fine of \$330 or serve a two-day liquor license suspension. Licensee will install age verification equipment and will use the equipment to verify the age of every patron who reasonably appears under 26 years old. Licensees are Sun Tae Lee and Ki Ja Lee.

**Cozy Corner**, 1207 West Central, Sutherlin; will pay a fine of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Ken's Toy, Inc., aka Ken-Toy, Inc.; Kenneth Rogers and Myo James, corporate principals.

**Tarks Market**, 215 E. Wagner Ave., Talent; will pay a fine of \$3,795 or serve a 23-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is Tark's, Inc.; Ronald F. Ridgway and Susan J. Ridgway, corporate principals.

**Your Break Tavern**, 210 East Main Street, Silverton; will pay a \$3,795 fine or serve a 23-day liquor license suspension. Licensees are Eric Braff and Tracy Braff.

**Seven Nightclub**, 1033 NW Bond Street, Bend; will pay a fine of \$330 or serve a two-day liquor license suspension. Licensee will install age verification equipment and will use the equipment to verify the age of every patron who reasonably appears under 26 years old. Licensee is Se7en Group, Inc.; Brian Timme and Megan Kleck, corporate principals.

**Macadam's Bar & Grill**, 5833 SW Macadam, Portland; will pay a fine of \$1,155 or serve a seven-day liquor license suspension. Licensee is S & V Properties, Inc.; Alan Volm, Ryan Steele, and Tallie Steele, corporate principals.

**Gusto Bistro & Marketplace**, 467 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, Lake Oswego; will pay a fine of \$330 or serve a two-day liquor license suspension. Licensee will install age verification equipment and will use the equipment to verify the age of every patron who reasonably appears under 26 years old. Licensee is Gusto Foods, Inc.; Helene Rimberg and Douglas Bae, corporate principals.

For permitting an employee(s) to mix, sell, or serve alcohol or supervise those who do without a service permit:

**Diamond Concessions**, 2760 MLK Jr. Blvd., Eugene; will pay a \$4,785 fine or serve a 29-day liquor license suspension. Co-licensees are Diamond Concessions, Inc., Douglas Elmore and Eileen Beban, corporate principals; and Eugene Emeralds Baseball Club, Inc., Bob Beban, Douglas Elmore, and David Elmore, corporate principals.

The commissioners of the OLCC approved the following liquor store location:

Retail liquor agents are independent contractors; they are not state employees. The Retail Services Division of the OLCC works closely with liquor agents to help them understand and follow liquor regulations and store operating procedures.

The five citizen commissioners are the policy-making body of the OLCC. They meet monthly for one or two days to make decisions on liquor licenses, rules, contested case hearings and appointments of liquor store agents. Commission meetings are held every other month at OLCC's main office, 9079 SE McLoughlin Blvd., Room 103A in Portland. Subsequent months, the meetings are held via phone.
