BOARD ACTION REPORT

***COOK, ROBERT DALE, MD; MD07347; TUALATIN, OR**

Licensee entered into a Voluntary Limitation with the Board on June 7, 2006. In this Order Licensee agreed not to perform total hip arthroplasty surgical procedures and agreed to refer patients needing this procedure to another physician.

***GEVURTZ, JOHN MILTON, MD; MD06871; PORTLAND, OR**

Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order on June 7, 2006. In this Order Licensee agreed to withdraw from the practice of medicine pending the conclusion of the Board's investigation into his competency to practice medicine.

***JENKINS, MICHAEL HAWLEY, MD; MD09397; PORTLAND, OR**

The Board issued an Order of Suspension of License on May 17, 2006 due to concerns regarding licensee's mental health. This action is permitted under Oregon Revised Statutes 677.225, which allows the Board to suspend a license if the licensee is adjudged to be mentally ill or is admitted on a voluntary basis to a treatment facility for mental illness that affects the ability of the licensee to safely practice medicine, and if the licensee's residence in the facility exceeds 25 consecutive days.

***KENDALL, Yvonne Nellie, PA; PA00712; Portland, OR**

Licensee entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board on June 7, 2006. In this Order, Licensee agreed to surrender her Oregon physician assistant license while under investigation. Reapplication terms are also specified should Licensee decide to reapply for a license after a period of two years from the effective date of this order.

***LEE, CAROL FROST, MD; MD12002; BEND, OR**

The Board issued an Order Terminating Corrective Action Order due to Licensee's successful compliance with the terms of her April 15, 2004 Corrective Action Order.

***MCCASKILL, MICHAEL FREDERICK, MD; MD10666; MEDFORD, OR**

The Board issued an Order Terminating Corrective Action Order on June 7, 2006 due to Licensee's successful compliance with the terms of his April 15, 2005 Corrective Action Order.


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3.3 Licensee stipulates and agrees that any violation of the terms of this Order shall be grounds for disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(18).



1. The Board of Medical Examiners (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing,

regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physicians, in the state of Oregon. Michael H. Jenkins., MD (Licensee) is a licensed physician in the state of Oregon.

2.

On May 16, 2006, the Board received written evidence that on May 10, 2006, Licensee had been determined by a Multnomah County Circuit Court judge to be mentally ill, based upon clear and convincing evidence, pursuant to ORS 426.130. Licensee was ordered by the same court to remain in the custody of the state Mental Health Division for involuntary care and treatment on an inpatient basis. Licensee was initially admitted as a patient on April 21, 2006, to a psychiatric hospital unit and, at that time, was placed under a two-physician temporary and involuntary mental health hold after being determined to pose a danger to himself and others. Licensee has continuously been in the custody of this mental treatment facility since April 21, 2006. Under these conditions, a license to practice medicine is subject to automatic suspension, ORS 677.225.

3.

ORS 677.225 provides that a licensee's medical license is suspended automatically if the licensee is adjudged to be mentally ill or is admitted on a voluntary basis to a treatment facility for mental illness that affects the ability of the licensee to safely practice medicine, and if the licensee's residence in the facility exceeds 25 consecutive days.

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4.

The Board therefore suspends the license of Licensee to practice medicine without a hearing, effective immediately, pursuant to ORS 677.225.

The Board of Medical Examiners (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining certain health care providers, including physician assistants, in the state of Oregon. Yvonne Nellie Kendall, PA (Licensee) is a licensed physician assistant in the state of Oregon.

2.

The Board proposed taking disciplinary action pursuant to ORS 677.205 against Licensee for violations of the Medical Practice Act, to wit: ORS 677.190(1)(a) unprofessional or dishonorable conduct, as defined in ORS 677.188(4)(a); and ORS 677.190(7) habitual or excessive use of intoxicants.

3.

Licensee completed PA school in 2000 and applied for an Oregon license in January 2001, at which time she was referred to the Board’s Health Professionals Program (HPP) due to a history of substance abuse. Licensee was required to participate in HPP as a condition of licensure. Licensee has subsequently undergone various evaluations, treatment programs, and has been monitored by HPP. Her diagnosis includes alcohol dependence and opioid abuse/dependence. The acts and conduct alleged to violate the Medical Practices Act are:

1 5.2 Licensee understands that should she reapply for licensure after two years, at a
2 minimum she will have to demonstrate compliance with a recovery program and
3 continuous abstinence from all psycho-active substances except as prescribed by a
4 physician for a documented medical condition. Upon reapplication, Licensee shall also
5 be required to satisfy the terms of OAR 847-008-0051, which states:

6 OAR 847-008-0051 - Reinstatement Following Surrender of Licensure
7 A licensee who wishes to be relicensed after surrendering licensure, must apply as
8 a new applicant, and submit the license application form and fee. If the license
9 had lapsed prior to surrender, the lapsed registration must be cleared by payment
of the back registration fees and late fee. The applicant must meet all current
licensing requirements before being considered for relicensure

10 5.3 Licensee stipulates and agrees that any violation of the terms of this Order shall be
11 grounds for further disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(18).




