It was moved and seconded that

THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT COMMITTEE REFERS THE APPLICATION OF CLIENT 31993 TO THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS FOR FURTHER REVIEW. THE COMMITTEE DOES NOT APPROVE THE ISSUING OF A LIMITED LICENSE, SPECIAL, PENDING BOARD REVIEW.

Members present voted unanimously to pass the motion.

CYNTHIA DREYER, MD: ADDRESS TO THE COMMITTEE REGARDING PRIVILEGES FOR LESLIE WERSCHKUL, PA

Dr. Dreyer addressed the Committee regarding Ms. Werschkul's training and competency to perform botox injections, laser treatment of skin and hair removal, and restylane or other filler injections. Dr. Dreyer clarified for the Committee that she is requesting approval for Ms. Werschkul to perform these procedures under Dr. Dreyer's direct supervision, with Dr. Dreyer being onsite at her office when Ms. Werschkul is performing the procedures.

It was moved and seconded that

THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS APPROVE LESLIE WERSCHKUL, PA, UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF CYNTHIA DREYER, MD, TO PERFORM BOTOX INJECTIONS AND RESTYLANE OR OTHER FILLER INJECTIONS ON THE FACE ONLY AND FOR COSMETIC PURPOSES ONLY AND LASER TREATMENT OF SKIN AND HAIR REMOVAL, UNDER DIRECT SUPERVISION.

Members present voted unanimously to pass the motion.

The full approval motion is detailed in the *Approval of New Licensees and Practice Changes Requiring Committee Review* section of the minutes below.

Dr. Thiringer recommended the Committee develop minimal standards for training and experience for the above requested procedures so that any supervising physician who requests the procedures for a PA who has met the minimal standards may be approved for the procedures without the Committee reviewing the request specifically.

It was moved and seconded that

THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS THE COMMITTEE ESTABLISH MINIMAL TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE STANDARDS FOR A PA TO BE APPROVED TO DO THE PROCEDURE BOTOX INJECTIONS, UNDER DIRECT SUPERVISION, ON THE FACE ONLY, FOR COSMETIC PURPOSES ONLY, TO INCLUDE THE PA HAVING OBSERVED AT LEAST SIX PROCEDURES, PERFORMED AT LEAST SIX PROCEDURES UNDER PERSONAL SUPERVISION, AND ATTENDED A FULL-DAY (8-HOUR) TRAINING.

Members present voted unanimously to pass the motion.

The Committee discussed the option to also require that the supervising physician be Board certified in Dermatology in order for a PA to be approved to do the procedure botox injections, but the Committee did not render a decision on this issue.

NOTE: 1-14-05 – The Board determined that a PA must meet the following minimal training and experience standards to be approved to use aesthetic facial injection products under direct supervision, on the face only, for cosmetic purposes only, in a dermatology or facial plastics practice only: observation of at least 10 procedures, performance of at least 10 procedures under personal supervision, and attendance at a full-day (8-hour) training.

0037 (2) *Exhibit A***

THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS APPROVE THE FIRST REVIEW OF OAR 547-050-0037 THAT ALLOWS A PA TO PRACTICE AT NON-MEDICAL SITES WITHOUT LISTING THOSE SITES ON THE PRACTICE DESCRIPTION IF THE DUTIES ARE THE SAME AS THOSE LISTED IN THE PRACTICE DESCRIPTION, AND REQUIRES THE MEDICAL RECORDS RESULTING FROM PRACTICE AT NON-MEDICAL SITES BE MAINTAINED AT THE SUPERVISING PHYSICIAN'S PRIMARY PRACTICE LOCATION OR THE NON-MEDICAL PRACTICE LOCATION.

Members present voted unanimously to pass the motion.

The PA Committee made minor revisions to the proposed administrative rule, to incorporate a few examples of non-medical practice locations. The Committee clarified that the Board already approved the removal of the Additional Practice Sites section of the practice description from the practice description form at the October 14-15, 2004 Board meeting.

It was moved and seconded that

THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS THE ABOVE MOTION REGARDING APPROVAL OF THE FIRST REVIEW OF OAR 547-050-0037 BE WITHDRAWN.

Members present voted unanimously to pass the motion.

It was moved and seconded that

THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS APPROVE THE FIRST REVIEW OF OAR 547-050-0037 THAT ALLOWS A PA TO PRACTICE AT NON-MEDICAL SITES WITHOUT LISTING THOSE SITES ON THE PRACTICE DESCRIPTION IF THE DUTIES ARE THE SAME AS THOSE LISTED IN THE PRACTICE DESCRIPTION, AND REQUIRES THE MEDICAL RECORDS RESULTING FROM PRACTICE AT NON-MEDICAL SITES BE MAINTAINED AT THE SUPERVISING PHYSICIAN'S PRIMARY PRACTICE LOCATION OR THE NON-MEDICAL PRACTICE LOCATION, AS AMENDED.

Members present voted unanimously to pass the motion.

NOTE: 1-14-05 – The Board revised the language of the proposed rule, replacing “non-medical sites” with “sites other than primary or secondary practice sites.”

0041(6) *Exhibit B***

It was moved and seconded that

THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS APPROVE THE FINAL REVIEW OF OAR 847-050-0041 THAT REQUIRES A PHYSICIAN REQUESTING EMERGENCY DISPENSING AUTHORITY FOR A PA BE REGISTERED WITH THE BOARD AS A DISPENSING PHYSICIAN.

Members present voted unanimously to pass the motion.

DEVELOP CRITERIA FOR APPROVAL OF CHRONIC/INTRACTABLE PAIN MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY

At its meeting on July 9, 2004, the Board questioned how it would know if a PA were using Schedule II prescription privileges to manage intractable pain. At its meeting on October 15, 2004, the Board chartered the PA Committee to develop criterion for the approval of PAs to manage chronic/intractable pain.

Ms. Haley reported to the Committee that the Board is writing administrative rules that will institute a CME requirement of six hours in chronic/intractable pain management and one one-hour course in Oregon law, both approved by the Pain Management Commission, for medical and osteopathic physicians and physician assistants. Ms. Haley indicated the courses would not have to be completed until 2009, and that the Board would accept any courses that meet the requirement taken by licensees since 2000.

The Committee recommended that a check box be added to the Prescription Privileges section of the practice description to request chronic/intractable pain management authority. The Committee also recommended that, if a PA requests this authority, the PA be required to attest on the practice description that the PA is in compliance with the standards set forth for the management of intractable pain in ORS 677.470 to 677.485 and for continuing medical education by the Pain Management Commission in ORS 677.510 (5)(a)-(b).

It was moved and seconded that

THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS A STATEMENT BE ADDED TO THE PRESCRIPTION PRIVILEGES SECTION OF THE PRACTICE DESCRIPTION SUCH THAT THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT WILL ATTEST THAT THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT WILL COMPLY WITH THE STATUTES THAT REFERENCE THE MANAGEMENT OF INTRACTABLE PAIN AND CONTINUING EDUCATION IN PAIN MANAGEMENT AS A REQUIREMENT FOR RECEIVING BOARD APPROVAL TO MANAGE CHRONIC/INTRACTABLE PAIN USING SCHEDULE II-V MEDICATIONS.

Members present voted unanimously to pass the motion.

The above changes will be incorporated into the practice description form for Committee review and approval at the next Committee meeting.

NOTE: 1-14-05 – The Board determined that the following requirements must be met in order for a PA to be granted approval of chronic/intractable pain management authority, only under direct supervision:

- ***The PA must have completed 10 hours of accredited training.***
- ***The supervising physician must have Schedule II prescribing privileges.***
- ***The supervising physician and PA must have the same chronic pain practice.***

The Board also determined that the supervising physician must review a minimum of 10% of charts for one year following approval. Board staff will draft administrative rules reflecting these requirements.

DISCUSS REVISION OF THE PRACTICE DESCRIPTION FORM

The Committee agreed to remove the Additional Practice Sites section from the practice description, per Board approval at its meeting on October 15, 2004. The Committee also agreed to add a check box under the Emergency Administering and Dispensing Authority section of the practice description that the supervising physician can check off to indicate the supervising physician is registered with the Board as a dispensing physician if the supervising physician is requesting emergency dispensing authority for a PA.

The above changes will be incorporated into the practice description form for Committee review and approval at the next Committee meeting.

Dr. Carlson clarified that his previously submitted descriptions of emergency administration and emergency dispensing were incorporated into the practice description at an earlier date. The Committee questioned if these descriptions need to be modified to reduce confusion amongst physician/physician assistant teams when filling out the practice description. Ms. Dolstra highlighted that OAR 847-050-0041 (4) specifies the information that must be submitted by a physician assistant who requests emergency administering and/or emergency dispensing authority in order for the Board to determine if the request can be approved. Dr. Carlson indicated that, whereas staff can approve a supervising physician's request for a PA to have emergency administering or emergency dispensing if the practice site is designated as medically underserved, the Committee shall approve requests for such authority for practice sites that are not designated as medically underserved. Mr. Gray highlighted that a supervising physician can further restrict the privileges of a PA from those privileges granted by the Board.

Staff pointed out that the statutory authority for a PA to have emergency administration and/or emergency dispensing authority is ORS 677.515 (5); the statutory requirement for the PA Committee to review requests by PAs for dispensing privileges is ORS 677.545 (2); and the statutory authority for the PA Committee to recommend criteria to be used in granting dispensing privileges to a PA is ORS 677.545 (4).

The Committee agreed to pursue the removal of the Emergency Administering and Dispensing Authority section of the practice description. Mr. Randolph and Dr. Carlson agreed to look at the current statutory regulations in more depth and to bring this issue back to the next Committee meeting.

It was moved and seconded that

THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS A CHECK BOX BE ADDED TO THE PRACTICE DESCRIPTION FORM FOR THE SUPERVISING PHYSICIAN TO INDICATE THE PHYSICIAN IS REGISTERED AS A DISPENSING PHYSICIAN WITH THE BOARD AND THAT THE ADDITIONAL PRACTICE SITES SECTION BE REMOVED FROM THE PRACTICE DESCRIPTION FORM.

Members present voted unanimously to pass the motion.

Mr. Gray clarified that a PA must have prescribing privileges in order to be granted emergency administering and/or emergency dispensing authority.

DISCUSSION ITEM: CAN PAs HAVE ADMITTING RIGHTS IN HOSPITALS?

The Committee received the following question from the Medical Staff Coordinator at Providence Hood River Memorial Hospital: Can PAs have admitting rights in hospitals?

The Committee agreed that, under ORS 677.515, PAs have admitting rights only on behalf of the the PA's supervising physician and under the supervising physician's name. The admission must be signed by the PA and counter-signed by the supervising physician.

LEGISLATIVE ISSUES

Ms. Haley reported on two bills going to the legislature. The first bill addresses the Board performing federal criminal background checks (fingerprinting) on applicants and licensees. The second bill addresses the expansion of the Health Professionals Program (HPP) to include treatment of mental health issues, with the caveat that sexual misconduct by an HPP participant will be reported to the Board by HPP.

NOTE: 1-14-05 – The Board noted that the second bill mentioned above, regarding the expansion of HPP to include treatment of mental health issues, is no longer being pursued with the legislature at this time.

Ted Ruback, PA, reported on the following bills being presented to the legislature this session by the Oregon Society of Physician Assistants (OSPA): SB 570, which would allow PAs to continue to see patients outside the clinic; and SB 569, which would allow supervising physicians to continue to supervise up to four physician assistants. Mr. Ruback also said the OSPA may pursue with the legislature the issues of 1) nurses taking orders from PAs, and 2) adding PAs to time loss/worker's compensation.

approved in dermatology or facial plastics practices, under direct supervision, on the face only, for cosmetic purposes only, and only after the PA has observed at least 10 procedures, performed at least 10 procedures under personal supervision, and attended a full-day (8-hour) training.

Pursuant to OAR 847-050-0010 (8) (c), "Personal Supervision means the supervising physician or designated agent must be at the side of the physician assistant at all times, personally directing the action of the physician assistant." Dr. McCoy must provide the Board with documentation of training and a letter of competency for review and approval, before Ms. Botelho may receive Board approval to perform these procedures under supervision other than personal.

As Ms. Botelho is a "New Hire", the required chart review is a minimum 50% of charts for the first 30 days, 30% for the next 60 days, and 20% for the next 90 days. After 6 months, chart review may be reduced to 10 percent of charts per month or no less than 10 charts per month. Dr. McCoy stated that he would review 90% of charts; the Board has concerns that this level of chart review will be difficult to maintain on a regular basis in a busy practice.

Pending Board review, emergency administration and dispensing authority is not approved, as the practice site is not designated medically under-served, and an on-site physician is available to issue a verbal and/or standing order.

IUD removal with string visible is a core competency. The notation "etc," in defining additional family planning medical and surgical services is not approved. All services not included in the Core competencies must be specifically named on the practice description in order to be reviewed by the PA committee and placed before the Board for approval.

Pending Board review and approval, emergency dispensing is not approved. Dr. Jagelski must register with the Board of Medical Examiners as a dispensing physician, before requesting dispensing privileges for a PA supervisee.

As Dr. Jagelski has never received Board approval as a supervising physician, pending PA Committee review and Board approval, the required chart review is a minimum 50% of charts for the first 30 days, 30% for the next 60 days, and 20% for the next 90 days. Approve Jennifer Lynn Campbell as a physician assistant in the State of Oregon, under the supervision of Jeffrey S. Swanson, MD, per submitted practice description, with Schedule II – V prescription privileges and the following amendments:

The following procedures are approved under personal physician supervision:

- Insertion of: Cut-downs, pacemaker wires, chest tubes, venous arterial cannulation, Swan-Ganz catheters, subclavian intrajugular lines, endotracheal tubes
- Opening mediastinal incisions and subcutaneous tissues – the Board requires clarification from Dr. Swanson regarding whether this procedure is re-entry sternotomy.

Dr. Swanson must provide the Board with documentation of training and a letter of competency for review and approval by the Board before Ms. Campbell may receive Board approval to perform these procedures under supervision other than personal.

As Ms. Campbell is a newly Oregon licensed PA, pending Board review, chart review is that of a new licensed PA; which is, 50% of charts for the first 30 days, 30% of charts for the next 60 days, and 20% for the next 90 days. After six months, chart review is reduced to 10% of charts per month, or no less than 10 charts per month.

NOTE: 1-14-05 The Board amended the Committee's approval as follows:

OREGON ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

CHAPTER 847, DIVISION 050 - BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS

PROPOSED RULES CHANGES – JANUARY 2005

FIRST REVIEW BY THE BOARD

Proposed administrative rules allow a PA to practice at locations other than the primary or secondary practice location without listing those sites in the practice description if the duties are the same as those listed in the practice description, and require medical records for patients seen at these additional practice locations to be maintained at the additional practice site or at the supervising physician's primary practice location.

847-050-0037

Supervision

(1) The supervising physician is responsible for the direction and regular review of the medical services provided by the physician assistant.

(2) The type of supervision and maintenance of supervision provided for each physician assistant shall be described in the practice description and approved by the Board. The supervising physician shall provide for maintenance of verbal communication with the physician assistant at all times, whether the supervising physician and physician assistant practice in the same practice location or a practice location separate from each other, as described in the following:

(a) The practice is listed in the practice description of the physician assistant and is pre-approved by the Board.

(b) Practice locations, other than primary or secondary practice locations, such as schools, sporting events, and health fairs, are not required to be listed in the practice description of the physician assistant if the duties are the same as those listed in the practice description. The medical records for the patients seen at these additional practice

locations will be held either at the supervising physician's primary practice location or the additional practice locations. The supervision of the physician assistant at locations other than the primary or secondary practice location shall be the same as for the primary or secondary practice location.

(c)[(b)] In any instance where the supervising physician or designated agent is not providing direct or personal supervision of the physician assistant as defined in OAR 847-050-0010 (8)(a) and (c), the supervising physician or designated agent shall provide for the maintenance of direct, verbal communication by telephone, radio, radio telephone, television or similar means but is not required to be physically present at the practice site.

(d)[(e)] The supervising physician or designated agent will provide a minimum of four hours of on-site supervision every two weeks.

(e)[(d)] The supervising physician or designated agent will provide chart review of a number or a percentage of the patients the physician assistant has seen during each month as stated in the practice description as approved by the Board.

(3) The degree of independent judgment that the physician assistant may exercise shall be in accordance with the Board approved practice description and supervision. The supervising physician may limit the degree of independent judgment that the physician assistant uses but may not extend it beyond the limits of the practice description.

CHAPTER 847, DIVISION 050 - BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS

PROPOSED RULES CHANGES – JANUARY 2005

FINAL REVIEW BY THE BOARD

Proposed administrative rules require the supervising physician of a physician assistant who is requesting emergency dispensing privileges to be registered with the Board as a dispensing physician.

Prescription Privileges

(1) An Oregon grandfathered physician assistant may issue written or oral prescriptions for medications, Schedule III-V, which the supervising physician has determined the physician assistant is qualified to prescribe commensurate with the practice description and approved by the Board if the physician assistant has passed a specialty examination approved by the Board prior to July 12, 1984, and the conditions in (2) (a) and (b) are met.

(2) A physician assistant may issue written or oral prescriptions for medications, Schedule II-V, which the supervising physician has determined the physician assistant is qualified to prescribe commensurate with the practice description and approved by the Board if the following conditions are met:

(a) The physician assistant has met the requirements of OAR 847-050-0020(1); or is an Oregon grandfathered physician assistant who has passed the Physician Assistant National Certifying Examination (PANCE).

(b) The applicant must document adequate training and/or experience in pharmacology commensurate with the practice description;

(c) The Board may require the applicant to pass a pharmacological examination which may be written, oral, practical, or any combination thereof based on the practice description.

(d) An application for Schedule II controlled substances prescription privileges must be

submitted to the Board by the physician assistant's supervising physician and must be accompanied by the practice description of the physician assistant. The Schedule II controlled substances prescription privileges of a physician assistant shall be limited by the practice description approved by the board and may be restricted further by the supervising physician at any time. To be eligible for Schedule II controlled substances prescription privileges, a physician assistant must be certified by the National Commission for the Certification of Physician Assistants and must complete all required continuing medical education coursework.

~~(3)~~~~(2)~~ The prescribing physician assistant, to be authorized to issue prescriptions for Schedules II through V controlled substances, must be registered with the Federal Drug Enforcement Administration.

~~(4)~~~~(3)~~ Written prescriptions shall be on a blank which includes the printed or handwritten name, office address, and telephone number of the supervising physician and the printed or handwritten name of the physician assistant. The prescription shall also bear the name of the patient and the date on which the prescription was written. The physician assistant shall sign the prescription and the signature shall be followed by the letter "P.A." Also the physician assistant's Federal Drug Enforcement Administration number shall be shown on prescriptions for controlled substances.

~~(5)~~~~(4)~~ A licensed physician assistant may make application to the Board for emergency administering and dispensing authority. The application must be submitted in writing to the Board by the supervising physician and must explain the need for the request, as follows:

- (a) Location of the practice site;
- (b) Accessibility to the nearest pharmacy, and
- (c) Medical necessity for emergency administering or dispensing.

~~(6)~~~~(5)~~ The dispensed medication must be pre-packaged by a licensed pharmacist, manufacturing drug outlet or wholesale drug outlet authorized to do so under ORS 689 and the

physician assistant shall maintain records of receipt and distribution.

(7)[(6)] A physician who supervises a physician assistant who is applying for emergency dispensing privileges must be registered with the Board of Medical Examiners as a dispensing physician.
