



On July 7th, 2006 the Project Warrior Team will attempt to break the standing world record of 133 BASE jumps in 24 hours by completing 200 jumps in a single day. The setting for this charity event is the Perrine Memorial Bridge in Twin Falls, Idaho. DANIEL G. SCHILLING, BASE JUMPER



Dan Schilling is the cofounder and chief executive of Kokopelli Western LLC, a consulting and development firm specializing in partnering post secondary institutions with industry. KWI develops academic programs and conducts marketing and recruiting for its academic clients. Dan holds a bachelor degree in social science, and a master's in organizational management.

In his military capacity he is the commander of the 125th Special Tactics Squadron, Oregon Air National Guard. His 20-year career is exclusively in special operations including USAF Combat Control and US Army Special Forces. He is a staticline and halo jumpmaster with over 1100 jumps. Among other military specialties Dan is a Special Forces combat diver, offensive driver, demolitions instructor and parachute rigger. He is also a professional civilian demonstration skydiver and BASE jumper.

Among his combat deployments are the first Gulf War, Operation UNOSOM II (known also as Task Force Ranger) and Uphold Democracy in Haiti. His awards include the Bronze Star with Valor, Joint Service Commendation medal, Air Force and Army commendation medals, and Armed Forces Expeditionary medal. He is also the 1994 recipient of the Noncommissioned Officers Association Vanguard Award for life saving at great personal risk. He received NCOA recognition for actions under hostile fire in Mogadishu where he is credited with saving the lives of two teammates.

He is coauthor of the book The Battle of Mogadishu from Ballantine Books. Dan collaborated with author Mark Bowden on the book Black Hawk Down and served as a consultant to Jerry Bruckheimer films on the movie of the same name. He worked extensively with the History Channel on its documentary on combat operations in Somalia. His writing has appeared in Cigar Aficionado and Parachutist, as well as the Chicago and Salt Lake Tribunes.

Dan is in demand as a motivational and patriotic speaker. He supports the Special Operations Warrior Foundation through these and other fundraising activities. His latest project for SOWF is to attempt to set a world record for BASE jumps in 24 hours. The Project Warrior World Record will serve to increase awareness of the hardships facing America's Special Operations families and raise funds in support of their deserving children who have suffered the loss of a parent in service to America.

He and his wife, Elizabeth, reside in Springville, Utah. They have one son proudly serving on active duty with the U.S. Air Force. He enjoys the Utah desert, skydiving, snowshoeing and writing in his spare time.
