

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## INTRODUCTION

The Lake County Historic Sites and Buildings Inventory was developed in 1981 as a project jointly funded by the Lake County Commissioners and the State Historic Preservation Office of Salem, Oregon. The impetus for this project came from Janine Cannon, Lake County Planner, who sought to develop a data base by which the county could show compliance with Goal Five of the Land Conservation and Development Commission. Her patience and work with John Tess of the SHPO led to the formulation of the dimensions of the project and the funding for it.

The mandate for the principal investigator was to carry out a comprehensive inventory of historic sites, buildings, and objects on private lands throughout Lake County. Exempted from this investigation were cultural resources on public lands, those of primarily archaeological or prehistoric dimension, and those within the bounds of the corporate limits of towns, in this case the City of Lakeview. Each cultural resource identified in the project was to be treated on a file sheet and accompanying photograph sheet. Legal land description, ownership, physical description, and statement of historical significance was to be provided for each item inventoried.

The inventory was to provide both a documentary and visual record of Lake County's resources. A color transparency and a black and white photograph were taken of every item entered into the inventory. In a number of instances detail photographs were also made which illustrated special features of craftsmanship of the structure inventoried.

## METHODOLOGY

Several methods were employed for the mounting of this project. Of fundamental importance were the following:

(1) Commissioner George Carlon who strongly supported this project wrote personal letters to some twenty-five key informants who lived in each of the major geographical sections of Lake County. Carlon's letters described the project, introduced the principal investigator, and asked the informant for his or her cooperation in the enterprise. This personal introduction paved the way for excellent research work with very knowledgeable residents of Lake County. Many hours were spent with these informants prior to the development of field notes and the taking of photographs.

(2) A general reconnaissance was made of a geographical area--such as the Fort Rock Valley or the Warner Valley--prior to field work. All sites of potential interest were noted on maps so that oral informants could be asked about these locations. This procedure created a visual image in the mind of the investigator so that he could speak with some

familiarity about sites as he worked with the oral informants. Careful work with BLM maps and U.S. Geological Survey quad sheets also led to the identification of potential sites and structures.

(3) Emphasis was made to develop a work list and carry out the inventory as completely as possible in a specific geographical area. This meant that several days of work were necessary, for example, to complete the survey of the Summer Lake Valley and Paisley areas. This technique, however, enabled the investigator to check oral informants against one another and to find absent home and ranch owners at their properties at odd hours. In a number of instances oral informants--such as Russell Emery of Buck Creek near Silver Lake--joined the investigator in the field and led him to sites in isolated areas or to places where a series of locked gates had to be opened to gain access.

(4) When an area was nearly completed, a visit was made to the local cemetery to secure biographical information and spelling of names as given on tombstones. This technique worked especially well at New Pine Creek, Lakeview, Westside, Paisley, Fort Rock, Summer Lake, and Silver Lake. The greatest danger in this procedure was the use of these cemeteries as a popular, summer retreat for Lake County's rattlesnakes. The Paisley Cemetery is especially attractive for rattlesnakes.

(5) Careful use was made of An Illustrated History of Central Oregon (Shaver et al., 1905) because of its frequent reference to barns, houses, and other structures in its narrative sections on Lake County. Other published accounts were, however, of limited importance in the early stages of this inventory.

(6) Once sites and structures had been identified and partially documented, a concentrated effort was made to develop historical information, especially biographical detail on the persons associated with the resource. This project was remarkably successful because of the extensive collection of scrapbooks of news articles and obituary clippings in the Schminck Memorial Museum, Lakeview, and the family history narratives of the Lake County Library. The gracious assistance of the curator of the Schminck Museum and of the Lake County Librarian made these research projects pleasant and very rewarding. Extensive use was also made of the 1900 Census--the most recent federal schedule available for research for Lake County. Additional work was carried out in deed records and with Jack Pendleton in the records of his title company in Lakeview.

These various methods, progressing in the order identified, led to the development of this comprehensive and well documented inventory.

#### SUMMARY FINDINGS

The most common theme appearing in Lake County's inventory is "agriculture: stock raising." The medley of barns, corrals, sheds, bunkhouses, and related structures testifies to the importance and long term role of

the raising of livestock in the development of Lake County. Minor themes included: military, transportation, education, town development, engineering/technology, and social. The numerical distribution of cultural resources in this inventory is as follows:

Some structure will burn, be razed, or be so altered that they are no longer worthy of inclusion in an inventory. Others come to light or emerge as unique examples and should be added.
