This year's poster theme "Coasting Along with Sea Level Change" was selected because changing sea levels pose a threat to many archaeological sites where people lived along the Oregon coast. The poster shows that sea level has slowly been rising over thousands of years, changing the shape of Oregon's coastline and submerging archaeological sites. Knowing what the coast looked like in the past when sea levels were lower may help identify archaeological sites that are now underwater and help us understand ways we can protect the archaeological record from future sea level rise.

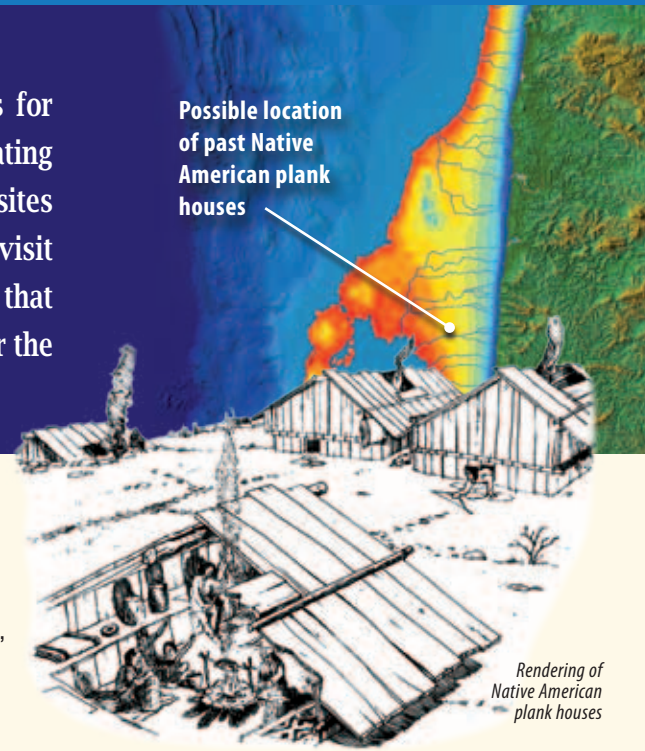
